




Rob's Column

Hello everyone

Well it's me Rob, I'm the person who does everything here at the Imperial office. Neil just lazies around whilst I design, write, and finish this Speccy fanzine type thing. (But who pays for it, tosser ? - Neil). You see I'm the one with the brains around here, I think Neils got an IQ of about 45. (Doah what's a IQ boss?-Neil)

Neil wants me to express my views on the Speccy. Personally I think that the Speccy is a great little machine, and pisses all over a Pentium P133 PC (Well at least we think it is, and if you don't we're going to send the boys round. Get it, got it, good.)

I have recently lent Neils +2A to compliment my 48K+ (Hey this dictionary is real good Neil, it's full of really big words.)

I've had a Speccy since 1989 when I got a rubber keyed 16K model, and since then it has been upgraded to 48K, and then finally onto a 48K+ model. As well as having several Speccys I've had an Amstrad CPC464+, a C64, an Acorn 3020, and an Opus 486 SX33 PC (Please forgive me. It was just a phase I was going through.)

Technical Bit

Networking on your Spectrum
Yes it is possible!

Well you wouldn't think it, but it is, and all you need is an Interface 1 compatible interface, two Spectrums (minimum), and a lead with a 3.5 mm jack plug at each end, and of course some networking software (which was on the microdrive demo cartridge, which you will have probably formatted by now). We will have some networking software available soon. Setting up a local area network, or net, lets you and your friends to play speccy games together. Like the really amusing guessing game, you would've got on the microdrive demo cartridge (bullshit!). It also allows you to send each other programs and data. This basically means that only one of you need type in a program. This is really good, especially if you only have one microdrive. This type of speccy network allows you to connect up to sixty-four speccy computers. Speccy networks should never be connected in a loop style format. Also each speccy should be left with one free network socket.

When you have set up your network each user should type in the following commands:-

FORMAT "n"; station number

This gives your speccy an identification number for the network. This then allows you to send messages to each other (ace or what!).

WARNING. Never turn of a speccy connected to a network, whilst it is transferring data, or communicated over the net.
