Yes it's true, and you read it here first. Believe it or not but there is still a large Spectrum user base in


the U.S.A. . Many of these users are constantly improving existing software and creating new and won-

derful hardware. There are still a lot of Spectrum programmers working out there aswell.

One of these many users have formed a small but steadily growing company called Zircom Computer Technologies. Zircom are basically a PC dedicated company but as a side-line they have ventured into the small but valuable Spectrum market.

On the grapevine Imperial has heard from one of its many contacts in the U.S.A. that Zircom have purchased the copyrights of the Spectrum computer

range. This includes everything that has been produced by Sinclair Spectrum and for Spectrum by Amstrad. A rough figure was mentioned by our contact. He said it was sold for just under \$700,000 or about £933,000 if you want to be fussy. This doesn't sound much but it is a large sum of money when it comes to the Spectrum scene. Although the Spectrum market is worth a lot more than the amount paid, I think that Alan Sugar and his cronies just wanted to get rid of it, as it wasn't one of their greatest assets.

Now back onto the subject of the all new Spectrum PC from Zircom Computer Technologies. The new Spectrum PC nicknamed then SPeCie has many new and old features. Here are a rundown of the specs.

As you can see that's a lot of hardware. I suppose in the end it's going to be worth the money you pay for it. Our contact mentioned a price of around \$1,500 that's about £2000 sterling. That's a really good price compared to some of the prices you see for 'normal' PC's on today's market.

Personally I'm going

to save up and buy one. The new SPeCie computer works in three ways:-

1. Dedicated PC mode
2. Dedicated Speccy mode
3. Both

1. Dedicated PC mode  
Well there's not much to say on this topic as all PC's are alike and work all in the same way.

2. Dedicated Speccy mode  
This works by pressing a 'MODE' button on the front of the computer. This switches you between PC and Spectrum. Once you have switched it to the Spectrum mode then your away. (So I've been told). When in the Spectrum mode you can do anything that you can do on a normal Speccy. All the functions of a +3 are there.

The tape facility works like a normal tape deck, the hard disk works like a Microdrive but uses different drive identities. On the SPeCie you have about 70 Megabytes of hard disk set aside for your Speccy programs.

3. Both  
This is just the Speccy mode in a window. It works perfectly as well as the dedicated mode.

Whilst in this mode you can change Speccy bits.

## Madam Divines' Game Boutique

## How to surf the net with your Spectrum!

What you need to get on-line with your Speccy:-

- \* A modem

- \* A subscription to a provider
