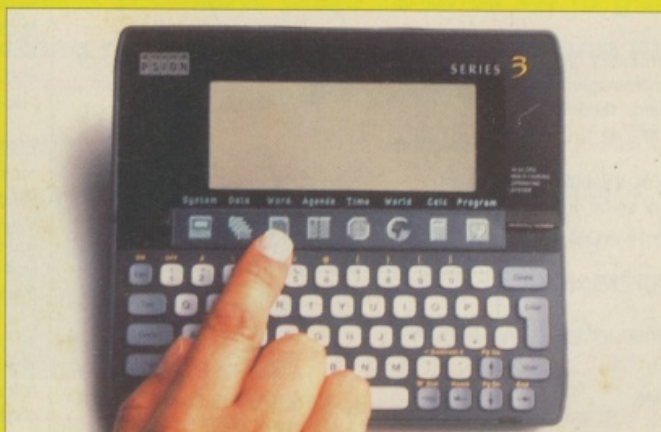

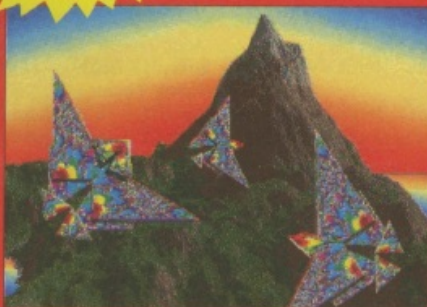

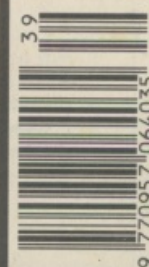

Chip up the old block

Acer International has announced that it is selling a 'Chip-Up' PC.

It is also claiming that this machine is the world's first - a claim which is easily upheld as no other company has as yet dreamt up the phrase Chip-Up.

What this means is that you buy an Acer 486SX which runs at 20MHz, and merely by fitting a new XD processor you can upgrade to a 33MHz 486DX.

The AcerPower 486SX comes with a 3.5-inch floppy, 120Mb hard drive, 2Mb of RAM and what the company likes to call Ultra-VGA compatibility. It is bundled with Windows, MS-DOS, a Microsoft mouse, and the Acer Disk Cache Utility (ADCU).

Acer's MD, Colin Gable, explains: "The AcerPower is the first system that allows users to virtually double processor power with the installation of a single, standard Intel processor." This is assuming that 20 to 33MHz is virtually doubling power rather than adding 13MHz.

The machine costs £3,445. The DX upgrade is £375.90. For more information call Acer on 0753 523024. ■

ST gets personal

Bay Computers has announced an enhanced version of its *Personal Database Plus*.

Although it is based on the shareware program, *Personal Database*, it is emphatically not shareware.

However, if you are registered user of the shareware version the upgrade is £7 cheaper than the commercial price - £12.95 instead of £19.95.

If you're not sure about buying the full blown system, a demo is available from many PD libraries (see *Express PD* listing on page 57 for the world's most comprehensive list of PD outlets). If you are already convinced then call Bay Computers on 0524 831162. ■

Atari rebundles games pack, updates Family Curriculum

A LITTLE EXTRA FOR THE XTRA

Atari re-affirmed its intent to make the ST an all-round machine in the eyes of the public with news for two of its major hardware/software bundles.

It is to add four new games to the Discovery Xtra pack. These are the hugely popular *Sim City*, which the company sees as being a crossover between straight game and educational bundle, *Final Fight*, a straightforward beat-'em-up, *Escape from the Planet of the Robot Monsters*, a chase and shoot-'em-up and *9 Lives*, a cutesy outing. These replace *Indiana Jones and the Last Crusade*, *Super Cycle*, *Dragon's Breath* and *Anarchy*.

The £329 price remains the same, and the move is seen as being a way of thrusting the 520STE back into the faces of the young buyer during the run up to the incredibly lucrative Christmas season.

MORE OF THE SAME

Also adding to the arsenal of Atari's ST product line is a tie in between the Xtra and Family Curriculum pack - the Family Curriculum is advertised on the back of the Xtra packaging. This serious STe bundle is claimed by Atari's marketing manager, Paul Welsh, as being "really incredibly successful". In fact it has

been such a success that Atari has run out of units to sell.

The educational bundle has also gained extra software in the form of eight new packs: Entry Level Productivity, Sound and Music, Home Accounting, Basic Programming, Word Processing, Database Management, Spreadsheet, and Programming Utilities. Each of the new packs costs £19.99 to £24.99.

PUT THE BOOT IN

Atari is not simply concentrating on the ST to up its profits and re-define it in the marketplace. Along with the new selling slogan "Seriously more than just a games machine", comes another, double-edged piece of ad-speak which is set to sell the colour hand-held Lynx. Based on the American advertising campaign, the slogan is: "Are you still playing that same old game boy?"

This can quite easily be read in two ways. First, as a straightforward, and rather bland question as to whether you are sticking with the 'same old game'. But second, and more interestingly because it declares Atari's perceived competition: "the same old Game Boy".

Apparently, Atari deems that Nintendo's mono hand-held Game Boy, which Paul Welsh

described as a "good machine to doodle with", and "a time filler", is their market target rather than the colour Sega Game Gear.

GOOSE IS GETTING FAT

So, with Christmas on the way and no news from Commodore on its main offering for the seemingly unassailable Amiga, Atari's re-hashed bundles and £2 million advertising campaign could be good news for all ST owners. On the other hand, the public may well not rise to what is simply a re-packaging. ■

Amstrad's £87m law suit

Amstrad is flexing its corporate muscle in an attempt to win £87 million in a law suit.

It is suing California-based drive makers, Seagate, for loss of reputation and, of course, money.

The case relates to Seagate's ST277R hard disk drivers which were fitted to PC236s. Amstrad is alleging that these dodgy drivers forced it to recall 7,000 machines.

Seagate is not lying down and rolling over however, it claims that the action is "without merit"

and that it will contest the suit.

Amstrad badly needs to protect its reputation which has been under constant attack in the media, and more importantly, in the City of London, since the company began trading in the late 60s.

With news that the company has had to write-off some £20 million of unsold stock, and is likely to announce halved profits of around the same figure next month, it needs all the help it can get. ■

School's out for CD-ROM

If you are still at school, or have a child who is, then make sure you get in touch with the head-teacher, and get them to call Hitachi. Failing to do this could see you missing out on a free CD-ROM.

The CD is MS-DOS, and RISC.OS (the Archimedes operating system compatible) and contains the full text of the Bible, 300Mb of demo software, several 32-bit images and utilities for the

Archie, as well as audio data.

Hitachi is not being totally charitable however, and it admits it: "The disk is being sent out to promote Hitachi's CD-ROM drives which have been recommended by the DTI/NCET's 'CD-ROM in Schools' scheme".

Called the Kidz mouse, it comes from Logitech and is said to be tailor-made for the toddling user of the 90s.

It is PC-compatible and has been ergonomically designed for "smaller hands". Instead of mouse buttons, the artifact has 'ears' which the kiddies can press to get the pointer to perform actions.

To avoid disturbing any of the grown-up mice which might be installed on the PC, the pint-sized version has to be activated by the child entering its name on a menu. This means that the device is not active all the time.

Kidz will be available just before Christmas in the USA — just in time for pressie-buying season. It costs \$79 (approx £50) and is expected in the UK next year. ■

Visit Iceland and live a little!

It might come as a shock to people who always thought of Iceland as one of the most boring countries in the world, that the country is to have the world's most advanced tourist information system.

Countries like the United States might claim that £600,000 (the price of the new Apple Mac-based system) is a little low to merit claims of 'World's most advanced' but that isn't worrying the Icelanders.

Their Travel Monitor system uses touch-screen technology, as well as the voice of the world's most advanced Icelanders,

Magnus Magnusson. Graphics, video, sound and text are all incorporated in the new system.

Twenty five Travel Monitors will be placed at locations around the country in Spring next year and will use several European languages to convey the delights of Iceland to visitors.

Just in case you are thinking of taking a flying visit to the land of cod and... cod, you should pay a call to Keflavik airport to see the Travel Monitor in full swing.

Finally, the Apple Centre Glasgow is a prime mover behind this trail-blazing use of multimedia in the public eye. Managing direc-

tor, James Dawson, says: "Our involvement with the Icelandic Government is a major step forward in our plans for continued growth into the 90s. The new venture will give Iceland, where tourism represents 14 per cent of the economy, the most modern tourist information and monitoring system in the world".

Good news for tourists everywhere is that, if a £600,000 system is considered to be a major national investment, and the most advanced system in the world, the future for such systems is immense in countries such as Italy, France, or even the UK. ■

Latest organiser from yuppie trend originators is set to put them back on top

PSION OF THE TIMES

Psion, the company which bought us the Organiser — the electronic equivalent of the FiloFax™ — launched two new 16-bit machines, called Series 3, this week.

And according to Psion's CEO, Sir David Potter, the new machines are: "... the world's most powerful pocket-sized computers". He continued, in a prophetic mood: "Eventually pocket computers will be carried by everyone and to fulfil this potential, advances in hardware miniaturisation, software utility and functions, and the user interfaces to access this power are required."

THE PSION ROARS

The Series 3 hand-helds are much in the same mould as the Organiser-bashing Sharp IQ and Atari Portfolio.

Rather than the upright boxiness of the machines which put the name Psion on the lips of every other stockbroker, barrow-boy and computer user, the new computers are lightweight (265g) and look like compact mirror cases.

The basic sub-£200 machine mea-

sures 6.5-inches by 0.9-inches — about the same size as a game of Travel Scrabble.

An impressive 128 or 256K of RAM is complemented by two on-board Solid State Disk Drives (SSDs) which are capable of storing up to 4Mb of data.

Bundled with the hardware comes

several built-in applications including a MicroSoft Word compatible word processor, a database, the OPL programming language which is already used with the Psion organiser range, and enables the user to program the systems' Graphic User Interface (GUI), there is also a calculator, and a time management system.

The utilities are accessed via touch-pad icons at the top of the machine. However, the diminutive keyboard does make actual use of the comprehensive applications a finicky task to say the least.

TALK TALK TALK

Communication with MS-DOS based machines is achieved using the Flash Filing System (FFS) via the optional RS232C interface.

Links have also been designed which will enable the machine to interface with Macs, modems, STs and Amigas among other machines. Access to Telecom (now BT) Gold, and other electronic mail services is also provided via a number of built-in scripts.

HELP IS AT HAND

Psion needs a boost back into the populist computer business. Its once famous Organiser range has been caught and overtaken by such machines as the Sharp IQ and Atari Portfolio. In fact the Organiser was beginning to look downright clunky when compared to these other machines.

Psion's range of MC1000 computers never caught the public imagination in the same way as the Organisers, and were not in fact pitched at the user in the street.

Equally serious for the company were reports such as that printed in *The Financial Times* late last month which reported a drop in profits and trouble on the horizon for the company.

However, the Series 3 machines, with 80C86-compatible NEC V30H processors, LCD screens and 384K of ROM-based applications software signal a re-birth of the company's reputation in the public eye.

Prices for the two machines are £199.95 for the 128K version and £249.95 for the 256K machine. ■

Nippy optics

Hitachi has announced a revolutionary advance in data transfer.

Called the APD, the optical system can transmit data at a breathtaking 10 Gigabytes (Gb) per second.

That is 36,000,000Mb an hour — the equivalent of 450,000 80Mb hard drives transferred in about the same time as it takes you to have lunch.

The system is based on the groundbreaking Iridium Gallium Arsenide (IGA) foundation.

Tests were carried out over a 100km distance and the data was found to be in tip-top condition when it reached its home. ■

Big Blue gets the human touch

In a move which could bring the feeling of the stock exchange or an air traffic control room, Big Blue, as IBM is known, has launched a touch-sensitive screen for its range of PS/2 personal computers.

The 8516 Touch Screen is a 14-inch colour monitor which can be used with input from a stylus, pencil or even a human finger.

IBM UK's personal systems manager, Howard Ford, says of the system: "Most touch displays currently in the marketplace incorporate overlays which can introduce problems with parallax or dimmed colours. IBM's pres-

sure transducer technology leaves the viewing area on the screen completely unchanged".

He continued to extol the systems virtues: "Uniquely, the 8516's touch function records not only where the screen has been touched, but also how hard; the harder you press, the faster you can scroll through a list".

The ability to use touch is achieved via fitting the system not only to the standard display port but also to the standard PS/2 mouse port — the mouse can be fitted in parallel to the system.

A major upside for owners of PS/2s is that no special adaptors

are required to fit the system.

Accompanying the 8516 on the scene are two new colour displays for its range: these are the 8515 and 8518. Both are 14-inch models. The 8518 supports standard VGA, while the 8515 which step up from that, and make use instead of the new XGA standard.

Good news for health conscious users is that ELF (Extremely Low Frequency) and VLF (Very Low Frequency) magnetic field emissions have been cut on all the new displays.

The price for the 8516 is £1,119. The 8518 costs £563, and the 8515 costs £678. ■

Philips DEC'd

Philips Electronics Information System Division is to be sold to the American PC giant DEC.

After months of deliberation, the European Commission has agreed to terms for the sale. It has also announced that this approval does not mean that it intends to allow either firm to "create a dominant position for itself in the European marketplace".

Philips IS division is just one of the massive Dutch company's operations. Its most public area at the moment is its Interactive Multimedia division, responsible for the development of Compact Disc Interactive (CD-I) system. This is not affected by the deal. ■

Competition for CDTV and CD-I

NEC of Japan is developing a new angle on the multimedia revolution.

Called the PC-VCR, the machine does not travel up the by now well worn path of CD, as is the case with Commodore's CDTV, and the Compact Disc Interactive (CD-I) school of thought. Instead it uses the more familiar VHS video standard.

Effectively it is a video cassette recorder (VCR) which can be controlled directly from a PC.

New developments for the system include a software add-on from multimedia developers, Jam. It has produced an interface which enables the hardware to work with IBM's latest multimedia device, the M-Motion Video adaptor.

It is claimed that M-Motion will allow video to be displayed on a straightforward PS/2 personal computer screen.

ALL THINGS TO ALL PEOPLE

Sources within Jam are claiming that its software, along with M-Motion and the PC-VCR will lead to a combination of video taped graphics and sound with computer produced text and animation to create presentations.

Jam president, John Marszlek said: "There is lots of video material. Also the PC-VCR is one-tenth the cost of most multimedia development systems, in comparison to \$7,000 to \$8,000 cost of the IBM InfoWindow or Sony ViewSystem. Although the PC-VCR might be as much as one third slower than CD-ROM, it is still of interest, especially in training and information displays".

However, with the increased production of CD-ROMs from companies such as Matsushita, Hitachi, Toshiba, Commodore and Philips and with laserdisk movies becoming all the rage in the US, this looks like too little too late.

An Amiga armed with the soon-to-arrive A690 CD-drive and a Genlock could quite happily carry out the same tasks for the same cost, with less reliance on third party software. ■

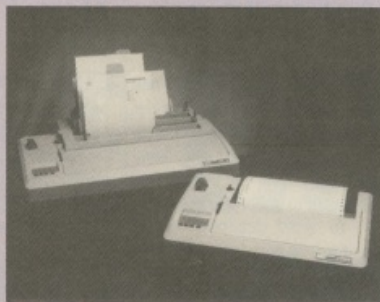

Commodore's plans to pep up its ancient and revered 8-bit computer, the C64, seems to have taken a turbo charge with news of the addition of *Terminator II* to a new bundle.

However, the bad news for people considering buying the C64 is that the price is likely to rise from £99 to £119.

AHEAD OF THE PACK

Express reported in issue 143 (way back on the 3 August) that Commodore UK's managing director said exclusively: "There are some very, very exciting plans for the C64 home computer this Christmas... they are probably the most exciting plans for the machine in five years". It now transpires that these plans include Arnold Schwarzenegger in his role as a T800 Terminator.

The Ocean game, which has been met with a mixed critical response, will not be alone in the bundle. Also included will be graphics software called *Image System*, and a slice of audio programming called *Modern Music Maker*.

Commodore is making strenuous denials that any such pack exists. However sources

close to it, and among its distributors, are convinced that Christmas will see the *Terminator* judging C64 owners left right and centre.

TO BE CHEERFUL

The reason for the Commodore denial appears to be that the company considers such as leak of information would damage present sales of its C64 bundle.

The inclusion of these new titles with the C64 will take the machine away from the

debacle of the C64GS console which was seen to damage Commodore's otherwise near perfect reputation in the home computer market. In effect, it re-affirms the company's commitment to its 8-bit.

OCEAN OF NEWS

Another piece of C64 related news will bring smiles to the faces of those who already own the machine, rather than those thinking of buying it.

Major UK software house, and the force behind *Terminator II*, Ocean, has announced that from 14 October it will be slashing 25 per cent from all C64 cartridges. Once again this must reflect the poor showing of the console. But nevertheless, it bodes well for users.

The cartridges, or carts as they are known, which can run quite happily in the C64 home computer, will plummet from £19.99 to £14.99. Six games are available on cart: *Batman the Movie*, *RoboCop II*, *Shadow of the Beast*, *Chase HQ2*, *Navy Seals*, *Toki* and *Space Gun*.

However, new games are expected both before and after Christmas. ■

The end of an era dawns as veteran publishing house shuts its doors

CRASH AND ZZAP! GO DOWN HARD

Don't bother searching the shelves for *Crash* or *Zzap!* 64 next month because they won't be there.

Along with *PrePress* for the Macintosh, *Games Master International*, for strategy game fans, and *Raze* for consoles, *Crash* and *Zzap!* have ceased to exist.

The publishing company behind the titles, Newsfield, has gone into what co-founder and director, Oliver Frey, called: "voluntary liquidation" with the loss of some 45 jobs and assets estimated at £500,000.

In the early to mid-1980s *Crash* and *Zzap!* are generally accepted as having laid the foundations for 8-bit computer leisure magazines as we know them today. Circulations of 100,000 and 70,000 copies a month were common in the boom years. But it all went sadly wrong because the company failed to move with the times.

No one at the company was prepared to comment on what would happen to outstanding subscriptions to the titles. However, a creditors meeting is planned for 15 October.

BAD LAUNCHES

Speaking shortly after the 45 Newsfield staff were stunned with the news that they no longer had jobs, Oliver Frey commented: "There are so many factors involved. Really what happened is that we just discovered we were insolvent."

In fact during a company search carried out by *Express*, it transpired that the last time Newsfield's declared audited accounts was September 1988 - almost three years ago.

And in the view of Companies House: "The companies latest filed accounts are too old for an assessment". A complaint to this extent had been lodged with the relevant authorities.

Frey continued in his description of the reasons which lead to the demise of his company: "We did some bad launches and made some mistakes, oddly enough not in the computer market".

He blamed magazines such as *Movie*, the video listings title.

Newsfield's commitment to 8-bit machines such as the Spectrum and C64 was never in question. However, it was seen as being late in launching into the 16-bit market. *The Games Machine* and *Raze* never took off in the same way as *Crash* or *Zzap!* in their heydays.

According to Frey: "The *Games Machine* never really sparked for us, and I don't think that *Raze* was ever really what we wanted".

STUNNED STAFF

Although Newsfield is remaining generally quiet about the whole affair, *Express* managed to get one employee to talk about the situation. However he refused to be named because: "I've got to look for a job now".

He told *Express*: "We were all called into the main editorial room, and this guy, I assume he was the receiver, told us that Newsfield was insolvent and couldn't go on. No-one was expecting it. I've been there five years, but some people had only just been taken on to launch *Sega Force* and *Nintendo Force*. We were all totally shocked."

THALAMUS THREAT

Newsfield also owns software house Thalamus. This company was responsible for *Sanction* and *Armalyte*. The future of Thalamus was hanging in the balance as we went to press. However, it is understood that the company had been given 48 hours to get its house into order. This time began on Tuesday 16 September.

THE FUTURE

The unnamed source also told us: "I understand that the directors are treating *Nintendo Force* and *Sega Force* as the major assets and will either try to sell them on, or maybe launch a new company. They would have to do this under another name of course. As for *Crash* and *Zzap!*, I think that they were under negotiations to sell them, but that they couldn't agree a price. I can't see them going on".

Although the demise of *Crash* and *Zzap!* is a sad piece of news it should not unduly worry 8-bit owners. The market is far from dead as the success of magazines such as *Commodore Format* and *Your Sinclair* shows. ■

It is known that three sub-standard versions of the software are already in circulation. Although these pale imitations claim to be the original, they are merely hacked versions of *DPaint III*, hacked versions of a demo, and a beta-version which somehow crept out of Electronic Arts offices.

According to EA's European MD, Mark Lewis: "All pre-release software from us is fingerprinted, we will soon be expecting to source the origination of this leak". And the culprits will be brought to book. ■

LOANCALC

Often, getting your mortgage and loan repayments into order can be a daunting prospect. With all those numbers, fluctuating interest rates and the thought of just where all your hard earned money is going, sometimes it's hard to keep track of what's going on.

Well, now your worries are over. On the Amiga portion of the *Express* Cover Disk this week is *LoanCalc*, a program that enables you to monitor all these niggly financial details.

LOADING THE PROGRAM

Before you do anything, make sure that you have first write protected the Cover Disk (move the notch in the top right hand corner of the disk so that you can see a hole through the disk). Then, make a copy of the disk (see the instructions in the Amiga back-up copy box) and always use that copy.

Once you have copied the disk, it's a matter of inserting your back-up copy into your internal disk drive and waiting for the Workbench screen to come up. Then, once it has, double-click on the *LoanCalc* drawer icon to open up another window with several other icons in it: one for the *LoanCalc* program itself, another to display the documentation for the program and several others which are data files that demonstrate what *LoanCalc* is capable of.

Double-click on the LC icon to run the program.

To see the documentation for *LoanCalc*, double-click on the LC.doc icon which will then display the documentation file automatically.

AMIGA BACK-UP COPY

- 1 Start your Amiga with your Workbench disk.
- 2 Take a blank disk and initialise it (instructions in your user manual).
- 3 Now enter the CLI, by double clicking on the CLI icon that is in your System draw on a standard Workbench disk.
- 4 Then enter the following CLI commands to set up our working environment (remember to press <RETURN> after each):
 MAKEDIR RAM:C
 COPY C:COPY/DIR/DELETE RAM:C
 COPY C:MAKEDIR/INSTALL RAM:C
 PATH RAM:C ADD
 PROTECT RAM:C RWE
 PROTECT RAM:C/COPY RWE
 PROTECT RAM:C/DIR RWE
 PROTECT RAM:C/DELETE RWE

- 5 Once you have entered the commands and the drive light has gone out, take out your Workbench disk and

put your *New Computer Express* Cover Disk in the internal drive (DF0:). To start copying, enter the following CLI command:

6 During copying, the machine will display a list of the files being copied. Once copying has finished, remove your Cover Disk and insert your newly formatted disk into the internal drive and enter the following commands:

COPY RAM:#? DF0:

DELETE RAM:#?

7 That's the first part of the Cover Disk copied. The next step is a bit more tricky.

Firstly, remove your copy disk and insert the Cover Disk into the internal drive. Enter the following:

DIR DF0: OPT D

The Amiga should then display a list of all the directories on your Cover Disk which will look something like the following:

c (dir)
 devs (dir)

l (dir)
 libs (dir)
 s (dir)

Write down this list onto a piece of paper (the '(dir)' extension is not needed).

8 With your Cover Disk in the internal drive, each directory that was listed has to be copied individually from the Cover Disk onto your copy disk.

So, as an example, to copy the c directory you would enter:

COPY DF0:c ALL RAM:

9 Now, remove the Cover Disk and insert your copy disk and type:

MAKEDIR DF0:c

COPY RAM: ALL DF0:c

DELETE RAM:#? ALL

Now repeat stage 8 for all the directories on the Cover Disk master. (So, in the CLI commands above, replace each instance of 'c' with the name of the directory to be copied). Once all the directories have been copied you will have a successful copy of the Cover Disk.

Following on from last week's Amiga and ST versions of *Air Warrior*, we have the PC version of the program. For your convenience we've printed the controls to the program across the bottom of the Cover Disk pages, so you don't have to worry about printing the document file that comes with the main program.

Once you've practiced your aerial skills at home, you can put them to the test on-line. Using a modem you can fly with, and even battle against, other pilots from all around the country.

YOUR PRE-FLIGHT CHECKS

But before you jump in and take off, it's worth finding out the controls. You can use the mouse to guide your plane through the skies by changing the position of the plane's control stick.

There are two types of keyboard commands: touch key and command line. Touch key commands work when you press the appropriate key; no other action is needed.

To access command line functions, press ESC, enter the command and then press RETURN.

CLEARED FOR TAKE-OFF

Load up the *Air Warrior* program for your machine and you find yourself looking at the main menu. At this stage you may wish to try the planes out on a safe practice airfield. Just select Transport from the menu bar and then choose a fighter or bomber by pressing the buttons which appear. The display clears and after a second or two you're looking out of your craft's main windscreen.

Ahead of you stretches the runway. First press 8 or + to get the engines fired up. Bombers with more than one engine need several presses on the keys to get them all running. Once the motors are going, press SHIFT and C together to open the throttles up to maximum. After a short delay you should see the backgrounds beginning to move as you taxi down the runway. Just keep with it,

TOP CHART

With *Top Chart* you can enter numeric data and see it displayed in a number of useful ways – as a bar chart, line graph and as a pie chart. And you can use *Snapshot* (also on the Cover Disk this week) which will save the picture for you to use in a graphics or desktop publishing (DTP) package.

LOADING TOP CHART

Before you do anything, make a copy of the Cover Disk. See elsewhere on this page for details on this.

To load the program, insert your back-up copy into the drive, click on the drive A: or B: icon, depending on which drive the disk is in, and then click on the ST icon to open its folder.

You will then see three other folders on-screen, one of which is labelled TOPCHART. Double-click on that to open it, then click on the TOPCHART icon to run the program.

USING TOP CHART

When *Top Chart* first loads, it will ask you to enter up to 32 pieces of data. Enter as many numbers as you want (up to the maximum of 32), and when you have entered all the data you want to, press Q and return.

After you have entered the data, you will be asked

to move the mouse to define the shape and size of the screen to put the graph in.

Then, you can move to the Display menu which will give you a choice of displaying your data as a Graph, Bar Chart, or Pie Chart. You can also label the charts by selecting a font style from the Type menu, and then go back to the Display menu and select Write. From there, enter your label or comment, press return, and then move the word(s) over to where you want to put them on the graph with the mouse.

The last menu, labelled Run/Exit, enables you to re-enter data if needed, or to redisplay it.

If you want to save the graphs, use *Snapshot* (see below) which is also on the Cover Disk.

SNAPSHOT

This handy little utility lets you save graphic screens for you to use in your own programs. It can save the screens from all GEM-based applications, it is claimed, as well as some programs that don't run under it.

The type of files that the program saves are in the .NEO format, as used by *Neochrome* and most other half-decent paint packages and graphics utilities.

LOADING SNAPSHOT

Before you do anything, make a copy of the Cover Disk. See the ST back-up copy box.

To load the program, insert your back-up copy into the drive, click on the drive A: or B: icon, depending on which drive the disk is in, and then click on the ST icon to open its folder.

You will then see three other folders on-screen, one of which is labelled SNAPSHOT. Double-click on that to open it, then click on the SNAPSHOT.TOS icon to run the program.

USING SNAPSHOT

Run *Snapshot*, as detailed above, and then load the program you want to save the screen from.

To save the screen press Alternate and Help at the same time to save the screen to memory.

Once you have made the Snapshot, you can exit the program and then return to the disk the other *Snapshot* files are in. Use SNAPSAVE.TOS to save the screen, and SNAPVIEW.PR to view them again.

ZAP ST

Zap ST lets you do is examine files, right down to the very last byte. This is handy if you wish to change any data within a program, or if you just want to see how a file is constructed.

LOADING ZAP ST

Before you do anything, make a copy of the Cover Disk. See the ST back-up copy box.

To load the program, insert your back-up copy into the drive, click on the drive A: or B: icon, depending on which drive the disk is in, and then click on the ST icon to open its folder.

You will then see three other folders on-screen. Double-click on the ZAP_ST folder to open it, then click on the ZAP_ST icon to run the program.

USING ZAP ST

Zap ST is based on the Amiga's *NewZap*, and even imitates the behaviour of the Amiga's mouse buttons. So, to access the pull-down menus press the right mouse button, and to select a function, release the button over the function you want.

These menus enable the loading and saving of files. To load a file, go to the leftmost menu and click on load to load the file. Then, once the file is loaded the screen will display a whole load of numbers. These numbers aren't meaningless – they are the loaded file represented as ASCII data which can be edited by simply moving through the data with the cursor keys and making changes at will.

At the bottom of the screen there are four arrow icons which have the function of scrolling through the file. This means that you can gradually scroll through the entire disk, examining and editing data at will.

And you can also move forwards and backwards through the file, and move to the top and bottom of it using the four icons at the bottom centre of the screen.

It is important to remember that if you do plan on making any changes to a disk or the files on it, always work on a back-up of the disk and not the original. ■

ST BACK-UP COPY

Be warned that because the disk is a complicated format, some of these instructions could be a bit tricky.

- 1 Format at least one blank disk.
- 2 Write protect the original *Express Cover Disk* (with the notch open so you can see the hole through the disk) and insert it into the drive. If you've got two drives, insert the Cover Disk into drive B. Double click on the drive B icon to open a window showing the contents of the Cover Disk. If you've only got a single drive a message appears asking you to put disk B in drive A. Just click on OK.
- 3 Insert one of the blank formatted disks into drive A (removing the Cover Disk if you only have one drive). Double click on the drive A icon and open up another window. You may be asked to insert disk A in drive A - you already have, so do nothing and just click on OK.
- 4 Highlight the ST folder in the drive B Cover Disk window and drag it into the drive A window.
- 5 If you only have one drive, you're asked to insert disk A and disk B at regular intervals. Be careful not to mix the two disks up! Remember, Disk B is the original Cover Disk and disk A is the newly formatted blank disk.

moving the mouse to keep the plane lined up with the runway. Your flight speed indicator shows your current rolling speed; once you reach 75 knots you can gently pull back on the mouse to raise the plane's nose. Alternatively, you can sit back and wait for the plane to catch enough lift to take off by itself.

UP, UP AND AWAY

Once you're in the sky (you see the altimeter winding clockwise), press ; to retract the landing gear and that's it – you're flying. You can now experiment with the various views to find out what's out there. When you've seen enough, press ESC followed by e to exit the game and return to the main menu screen. If you think you're ready, use the File menu to get you into terminal mode where you can log on to the on-Line network and fly against a host of beginners and experts in the biggest dogfight of your life.

AIR WARRIOR

Last week we featured the Amiga and ST versions of this revolutionary multi-user flight simulator. Now PC users have the opportunity to soar to similar heights with *Air Warrior* for their machines.

In case you missed the information on *Air Warrior* printed last week, the game enables users to log on to On-line Entertainment's system and take part in a breathtaking multi-user entertainment extravaganza.

TO START THE GAME

Before you do anything with the Cover Disk you must do two things. Firstly, write protect it (move the notch in

the top right hand corner of the disk so that you can see a hole through it). And after that, make a copy of the disk for your machine – see the instructions in the PC back-up copy box.

Next the *Air Warrior* file itself has to be copied. If you go to the PC directory on the Cover Disk (type A:\ or B:\, depending on which device your 3.5 inch drive has been assigned as) you will see two files there: AIRWAR.LZH and LHARC.EXE. Both of these need to be copied to a blank, formatted disk or your hard drive.

HARD DRIVE INSTRUCTIONS

To make a directory on the hard disk to copy the files to, enter C:\ and type MKDIR AIRWAR or MD AIRWAR to create a directory called AIRWAR.

Now, go back to the A:\ drive and copy the files from the floppy to the hard drive. To do this, type: CD PC (if you're not already in the PC directory). Then enter: COPY AIRWAR.LZH C:\AIRWAR. Repeat the commands for LHARC.EXE by replacing the AIRWAR.LZH filename with LHARC.EXE.

FLOPPY DISK INSTRUCTIONS

To copy the files to another floppy disk, insert the Cover Disk and go to the A:\ drive (or B:\, depending on which drive your 3.5-inch drive is). To copy the file, enter CD PC to change to that directory. Then, type: COPY AIRWAR.LZH B: (or A:\ if you only have one drive and it is assigned as B:\).

Repeat these commands to copy LHARC.EXE across by replacing AIRWAR.LZH with LHARC.EXE in the commands above.

DE-ARCHIVING

Once you have made a copy of the disk, the AIRWAR.LZH file needs to be de-archived. Unlike the previous two Cover Disks, the files for the PC are not self-extracting.

Before you extract the file, format a blank disk to save the de-archived files to. Next, insert your back-up copy of the Cover Disk in your internal drive. Change to that drive, if you are not already accessing it.

To de-archive the file, enter: LHARC X

SOFTWARE

AIRWAR.LZH B:. This will extract the file to the other drive, if you have two floppy drives (but make sure the destination drive – that is, the drive you are dearchiving the file to – is a 3.5-inch drive or a 1.2Mb 5.25-inch model), or the internal drive in which case you will be asked to swap disks a number of times.

Be patient when you are asked to swap disks, as you will be asked to do this a quite a few times. The program will be extracting each time you swap disks, but because of the large size of some of the *Air Warrior* files, this may not always be apparent – there will be long periods of disk-swapping without you being informed that much is happening.

Alternatively, if you have a hard drive, you can de-archive *Air Warrior* to that. To do so, switch to the disk that you have the copy of the Cover Disk on (either A:\, B:\ or C:\) and type: LHARC X AIRWAR.LZH C:.(directory name) The file will then be dearchived onto the hard drive reasonably quickly.

Remember: *Air Warrior* can only be extracted to disks with a capacity of 720K upwards, so this limits you to 3.5-inch and 1.2Mb 5.25-inch floppy disks, and hard drives. Once *Air Warrior* has been de-archived, you can view the documentation for the game by typing: TYPE README.

Enter AIRWAR.EXE and the game will load. *Air Warrior* can be controlled by either a joystick, mouse or the keyboard. The controls are documented in the README file, but for your convenience we have listed the main functions in the *Air Warrior* Players Guide at the bottom of the Cover Disk pages. ■

PC BACK-UP COPY

Be warned that because the disk is a complicated format, some of these instructions could be a bit tricky.

- 1 If you've only got a floppy drive-based system, format at least one blank disk. Otherwise use your hard drive.
- 2 Write protect the original *Express* Cover Disk (with the notch open so you can see the hole through the disk).
- 3 Use the XCOPY command to make the backup. If you have only one floppy drive, load XCOPY from the system disk from drive A:\ with the /S option to copy the files across. So, to copy the files across type: XCOPY A:\PC\.* B: /S. Then it is just a matter of swapping disks in and out of the drive until the Cover Disk is copied. Don't worry if you think you must have two drives – the XCOPY command will treat your single drive as both, or it will copy to the B:\ drive if, in fact, you do have two drives.
- 4 If you have a hard drive, put the Cover Disk in drive A:\, then type: XCOPY A:\PC\.* C: /S to copy all the subdirectories to the hard drive.

DPaint 4: THE BEST

If there is a single package that everyone associates with the Amiga, it must surely be Electronic Arts' *Deluxe Paint*. During its six years of existence, *DPaint* has remained the number one choice for anyone wanting to produce high quality graphics on the Amiga. Others have tried to match it, but even today *DPaint* still reins supreme.

Despite the fact that earlier releases of *DPaint* look rather sad these days (*DPaint 1* is particularly bad), Electronic Arts (EA) has managed to keep *DPaint* at the top of the pile thanks to its policy of continual product development. Many thought that the program just couldn't get any better when EA launched *DPaint 3* back in 1989, but it's proved them all wrong with the release of *Deluxe Paint 4*.

Combining everything that made *DPaint 3* such a success with more than a handful of new tricks, *DPaint 4* looks set to continue EA's dominance of the Amiga graphics market.

EA has put a lot of work into *DPaint 4* and it really does show – if you thought *DPaint 3* was something special, then you're really in for a shock. Instead of just bolting on a few new routines (which is what most developers would have done), EA has taken *DPaint* and re-worked it totally. For starters, gone is the rather flat looking user interface that has become the trademark of *DPaint*. In its place is a very swish metallic-looking user interface that brings *DPaint* in line with the latest version of Workbench (version 2.0).

That familiar icon strip and many of the pull down menus are still there, but nearly every gadget and every requester has undergone some kind of change.

BREAKING BARRIERS

Features-wise, the most major addition to *DPaint*'s armoury has to be HAM support. Up until now, *DPaint* was limited to a maximum of 64 colours on-screen at once (in HalfBrite mode), but *DPaint 4* has broken the colour barrier with its unreserved support for what is undoubtedly the Amiga's quirkiest screen mode. EA had insisted for years that HAM mode was never on the cards, but it's eaten its hat with the release of *DPaint 4*.

As a result, *DPaint* now supports all the Amiga screen modes, allowing you to create artwork in anything from 2 to 4096 colours, with every Amiga screen resolution supported including overscan. When painting in HAM mode, all the usual *DPaint* painting functions are still available, but they're made somewhat more powerful with the availability of all those extra colours. In particular, the gradient file option is totally enhanced by the presence of HAM, allowing you to create the kind of effects that even *Photon Paint* users could only dream of.

Colour control is one area of *DPaint* that has been enhanced beyond belief. Instead of the usual *DPaint* palette requester, *DPaint 4* now boasts a very powerful Quantel Paintbox-like mixing plate (an easel, if you like) which allows you to create colours by mixing others

together. You can, of course, still define colours using the old and trusty method of setting up RGB or HSV values, but you'll soon grow to love this new somewhat more artistic approach.

DPaint's range controls have also been enhanced. Instead of just selecting the start and end colours within your existing palette, you can pick the start and end colours from anywhere and place them on to a range bar. What's more, you're not just restricted to just two colours – simply by placing extra colours in between the start and end colours, *DPaint* will automatically generate rainbow-like ranges. This feature works best in HAM mode, but it's useful in other modes too.

ALL FILLED UP

DPaint has always featured very powerful gradient fill options, but *DPaint 4*'s gradient fills are miles better than those to be found within previous releases. As well as the standard horizontal, vertical and shaped gradient fills, *DPaint 4* adds contour gradients, concentric circle fills, line shading and a lot more besides. These take a little longer to work, but the results are more than worth it. *DPaint*'s gradient fills were always a little flat, but

these new fills allow you to add a greater feeling of depth to your artistic creations.

Another very nice feature that works particularly well is anti-aliasing, which is a method of smoothing out the jaggies when drawing circles, etc. *DPaint* supports two levels of anti-aliasing – low and high. High gives the best results, but takes much longer. This can also be used to smooth out brushes, although it doesn't always produce favourable results. Once again, anti-aliasing works best in HAM mode.

DPaint 4 contains so many new painting tools that it would be practically impossible to list them all here. Many of them have been designed with HAM mode in mind, although some work equally well in the other Amiga screen modes.

ANIMATE!

Animation is a relatively new addition to the *DPaint* toolbox (it wasn't included until version 3), but even so EA has still managed to enhance it beyond recognition. Version 3 of *DPaint* was never really that good for creating animations from scratch, but *DPaint 4*'s new lightbox and other animation tools make the program a worthwhile alternative to dedicated animation systems like Entertainment International's (EI) *Disney Animation Studio*. For starters, animation control has been made considerably easier.

DPaint 4 now has a very handy little animation control panel that – when activated – runs along the bottom of the screen. This control panel works in a very similar fashion to the controls on a domestic video recorder, allowing you to stop, play, advance and back-track through your animation. Many of the extra animation tools can also be initiated from this control panel, making the process of creating and controlling animations far easier.

EI's *Disney Animation Studio* was the first Amiga animation program to offer true onion skin editing, but

PROVIDING THE COMPETITION

DPaint has the 32-colour paint package market practically sewn up, but there are quite a few HAM-based paint packages available.

DIGIPAIN 3 – NewTek's offering to Amiga HAM artists is a fairly capable system that has been optimised for the task of cleaning up digitised artwork. It lacks many basic painting functions, but it's ease of use and

powerful effects are second to none. It's also one of the fastest HAM paint system available. One thing is for sure – it certainly runs rings around *DPaint*'s HAM mode operations! **PHOTON PAINT 2** – *Photon Paint* has been around for more years than I dare to mention, but it still remains one of the best HAM paint packages available. Its user

interface isn't quite as easy to use as either *DPaint* or *DigiPaint 3*, but it's a very capable system nonetheless. In terms of basic painting tools, it certainly gives *DPaint* a run for its money. If you can't quite stretch to *DPaint 4*, then *Photon Paint 2* may be worth investing in – these days it can be picked up for little more than £25!

JUST GOT BETTER

DPaint too now boasts this very powerful feature. *DPaint's* Light Table ('onion skin') is obviously a Disney trademark!) allows you to view previous frames behind the one you are working on. You just won't believe how much simpler this makes the process of drawing frames by hand – because you can actually see the previous two frames, this gives you a much better idea of how the next frame must be drawn.

Creating movement paths is also a lot simpler. Simply by holding down the ALT key and dragging your brush across the screen, *DPaint* will automatically render the movement into each frame. Very nice!

BRUSH STROKES

You may think *DPaint 3's* AnimBrushes were something special, but *DPaint 4* still has a few tricks of its own. For starters, many of the brush operations have been tidied up considerably, making the process of using AnimBrushes so much easier. For example, you can now hold two brushes in memory at once and flick between them whenever you need to. This definitely beats having to use the sparescreen as a temporary store for brushes!

DPaint 4's answer to AnimBrushes is its new Metamorph function which – as the name suggests – can transform one brush to another over a specified number of frames. It works in a very similar fashion to the tweening process to be found within polygon-based animation programs like Broderbund's *Fantavision* and Aegis' infamous *Animator*. Simply by picking up two brushes (the first must be stored as a spare) and selecting the metamorph function, *DPaint* will automatically generate an animbrush of the transformation. This feature has some quite wonderful applications – for example, you could create some really spectacular video effects. Just imagine being able to automatically transform one page of titles to another! The mind boggles at the kind of things that this feature could create.

Brush metamorphosis doesn't really come into its own until you start playing around with HAM brushes. They take a very long time to generate, but boy are they worth it! When I first tried this out for myself, I picked up two different faces from a digitised image and transformed the first to the second. Creating an animation to display my animbrush, the quality of the transformation was amazing! Believe me, words really can't describe the feeling you get when you see your first HAM mode brush metamorphosis!

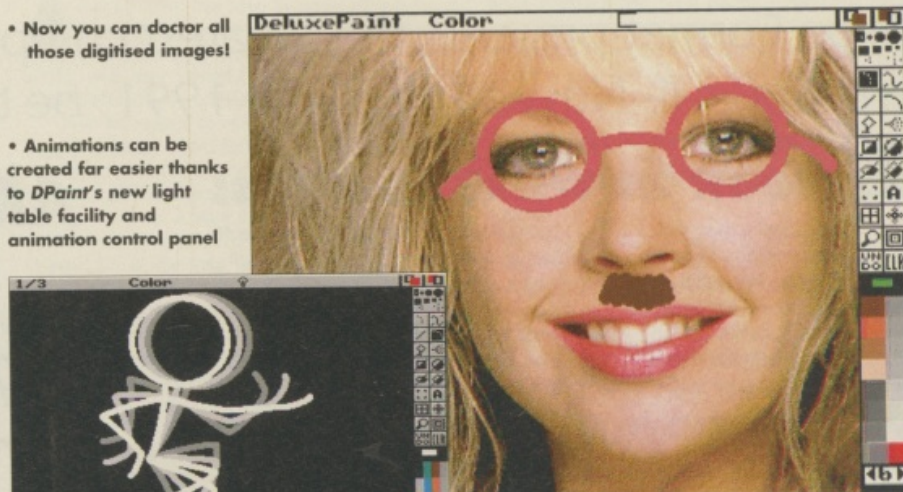
TOO GOOD TO MISS?

DPaint 4 certainly isn't perfect – but it's getting there. The only gripe that I could possibly level at *DPaint* is its speed of operation. Previous releases of *DPaint* were pretty swift, but HAM mode has slowed *DPaint* down considerably. This isn't a problem if you've got an accelerated Amiga, but things can really slow down terribly when *DPaint 4* is run on a standard 7.16MHz Amiga. Despite this undoubtedly quite major gripe, you'd be a fool to miss out on *DPaint 4*. If you already own *DPaint* (which, let's face it, most Amiga owners do), then upgrading to version 4 is the logical thing to do. If you don't own *DPaint*, then now is undoubtedly the time to take the plunge.

Quite simply, the new painting and animation tools that *DPaint 4* offers are just too good to miss. I for one will be sending a cheque to EA as soon as I pick my jaw back up off the floor. If you're even remotely interested in creating graphics and animations on the Amiga, *DPaint 4* is definitely the program to own. Even if you don't enjoy tinkering with graphics, it could be the program that changes your mind – it really is that good! ■

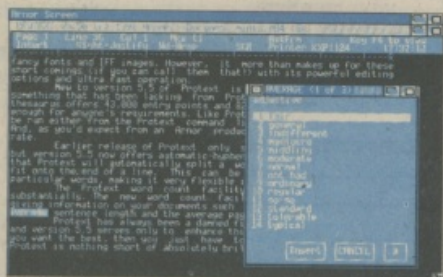

Arnor's Protex has been available for the Amiga for a number of years now and has established itself as the defacto standard for users looking for a fast and very powerful text processor used by professional writers worldwide.

With the release of version 5.5, Protex just keeps on getting better! Like InterWord (reviewed last week), Protex isn't a word publishing program. That is, it won't allow you to mess around with fancy fonts and IFF images. However, it more than makes up for it with its powerful editing options and ultra fast operation. New to Protex 5.5 is the long awaited thesaurus, offering 43,000 entry points and 827,000 responses – more than enough for anyone's requirements.

Like Protex's spell checker, it can be run either from the Protex command line or from pop up windows and works at a blistering rate. Version 5.5 also offers automatic hyphenation – it will automatically split a word that will not fit on the end of a line and can be turned on or off making it very flexible. The Protex word count facility has also been enhanced substantially. The new word count facility offers text analysis, giving information on your documents such as the average

word, sentence and page length. Protex has always been a fine word processing system, and version 5.5 serves only to enhance this opinion still further. If you want the best, then you just have to buy Protex – put simply, Protex is nothing short of absolutely brilliant. ■

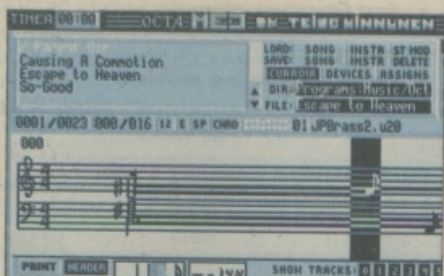

Everyone knows that the Amiga is a very capable system when it comes to creating music. Whether you want to tickle the ivories via MIDI or just write a jingle or two using the Amiga's sound chip, a large number of packages are available. One of the cheapest is OctaMed 2.0, the latest release of Teijo Kinnunen's acclaimed Med program. Originally released as a PD program, Teijo has enhanced Med beyond belief and has turned it into a commercial release that can give any of the competition a good run for their money.

Although OctaMed supports MIDI, it is primarily a package designed to allow you to create fairly complex tunes using sampled or synthesised instruments played using the Amiga's internal sound chip. But what really separates OctaMed 2.0 from the competition is its ability to play eight instruments simultaneously. Theoretically this shouldn't be possible since the Amiga only has four sound channels, but you can now create sequences (or 'patterns') using an ultra-friendly staff-based editor which is a lot easier to use than the usual hex-based editing of such programs as Sound Tracker and TFMX.

OctaMed is a great little program that is enhanced still further by its amazing price tag. The only real snag is the fact that you don't get any form of printed manual

or packaging – the manual is held on disk as a text file, so it's worth printing this out if you've got access to a printer. In reality, OctaMed is just so easy to use that you really don't even need the manual.

In all, OctaMed is one of the few bargains around at the moment. If you're feeling musical, then why not check it out for yourself! ■

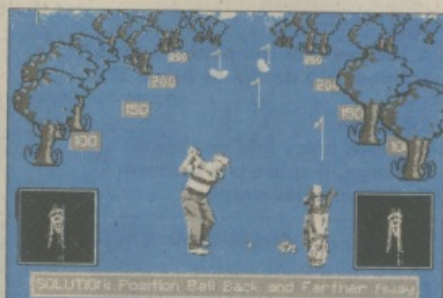

PC users who are avid golfers might be able to improve their skills by using a new golf instruction program from MicroLeague. Personal Pro is not a game like Links or PGA Tour Golf, it is serious attempt to provide useful golf tuition on a PC.

After entering a personal profile – including age, handicap and experience – you are prompted to select the problem which is the scourge of your game. 12 ailments are catered for, from slicing to hooking, and shanking to skying, and 10 or more questions are asked about the problem, before revealing the cause and what corrective action must be taken.

Personal Pro is very thorough in its analysis. An overwhelming number of do's and don'ts are produced for each problem. It gives so many that you'd end up missing the ball altogether trying to anchor the swing, clear the left hip and maintain a constant spine angle.

A much clearer illustration of both problem and solution follows the initial barrage of instruction. An animated golfer emulates the problem – showing a simple cause and a simple remedy before your eyes. This is the best part of the program as it provides plain advice which can be easily followed.

Personal Pro is too complicated for beginners because the questions and solutions are so involved and I doubt if experienced players would cart a laptop around the course, but Personal Pro is a useful tool for the inevitable post-mortem on why you lost – again. ■

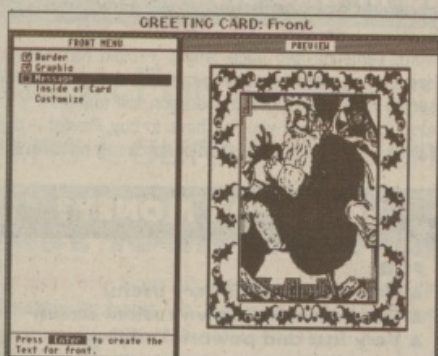

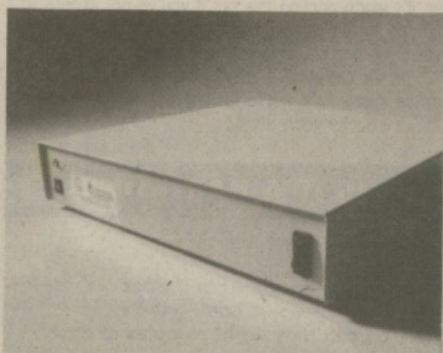

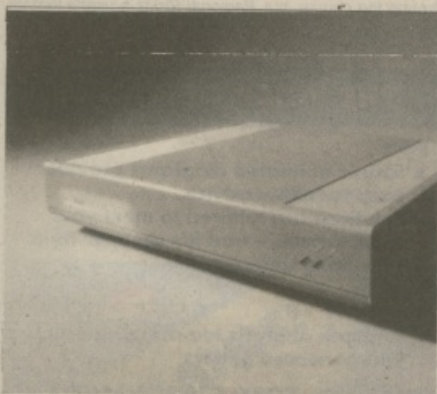

Anyone who has a creative urge to turn their PC into a miniature design studio is well provided for with a new release from Domark. *The New Print Shop*, funnily enough, is an updated version of *The Print Shop*, and is a versatile program which can create greeting cards, signs, posters, invitations, certificates and stationery.

It is extremely easy to use because the same procedure is followed whether you are producing a birthday card, a wedding invitation or a poster. As Christmas will soon be upon us I tried creating a Christmas Card.

The design method is simple - select a border style (holly), choose and place some graphics (a jovial Santa Claus), and enter the message. A library of graphics, borders and letterheads is included, so you will soon be producing elaborate creations.

The more serious users can use the graphics editor to design their own pictures. The editor is rather basic, and requires a great deal of perseverance if worthwhile pictures are to be produced. However, graphics can be imported from earlier versions of *The Print Shop* or purchased from a *The Print Shop* graphics library.

The quality of output from *The New Print Shop* ultimately depends on your printer - over 150 printers

are supported, including colour.

At £39.99 *The New Print Shop* is a good buy if you have the necessary hardware to produce quality output - but there is no point buying this program just to draw pretty pictures. ■

Ladbroke's 52Mb hard drive is a real workhorse. It's neatly packed away in a sturdy grey case which is tough enough to take a Mega and its monitor stacked on top. Mounted on the front of the case are the all-important drive switches - one to turn the beast on, and another to change the SCSI ID, so that you can link extra drives to the system. Round the back you find two DMA ports - one to link directly to the ST and another for connection to the extra drives. Ladbroke has made light work of the job of expanding your hard drive system (one's never enough once you've started!) by providing these two features in easy-to-access positions.

Inside the case is a Quantum drive which interfaces to the ST via the near-industry-standard ICD host-adaptor. Ladbroke supplies the full ICD Advantage software, plus a copy of *Turtle*, the hard-drive backup program. The drive can be set up to utilise a 64K RAM cache to speed up accessing and it also has the ability to auto-boot and auto-park.

In operation, the Ladbroke 52Mb drive is very quiet and extremely reliable. It can work with most emulator boards (like AT-speed, Spectre GCR) without problems and can even be reconfigured to hold Macintosh, IBM and ST partitions.

On the price front, it compares very favourably with

other drives of this size, at £429. If you wish, you can opt for a version without a clock, saving yourself £20, but you'll lose the ability to stamp files with the correct date and time.

If you're thinking of buying a hard drive and you intend it to form part of a larger system, you should look at the Ladbroke drive very seriously. It's fast, reliable and you can tailor it to your needs very easily. ■

Atari's Megafile is the original ST hard drive. Designed by Atari itself, it fits in neatly with the range of ST Mega equipment. It comes in a grey, plastic case which can be placed underneath the Mega's system unit.

Unlike most other hard drives, the Megafile is a custom-built unit, which can only be interfaced to an ST - there's no SCSI. While this guarantees compatibility with your ST, it can be a problem if you want to expand your system later. The drive is supplied with ports for DMA input and output for connection to the ST and another drive, but you need to change the Megafile's ID numbers if you link it with other drives. This is a job which Atari recommends you leave to an authorised dealer.

Even if you're only thinking of owning one hard drive, it may still be worth looking further than the Megafile. It's probably the noisiest hard drive available for the ST - largely due to the internal cooling fan, but partially due to noisy drive heads. It's also one of the slowest drives too - this is much more likely to cause annoyance.

Installing the Megafile is a tedious job, which Atari doesn't seem to have realised - the enclosed documentation and software doesn't exactly make the job much easier. There's just enough data and instructions to get the drive up and running, but not much to help you customise it, or back any of it up later.

If you're worried by tales of STE DMA incompatibilities, or you just want to remain Atari-loyal, think twice. There are plenty of drives which offer more features, are much faster and quieter, and are 100 per cent compatible. It's really not worth the £369 price tag to get stuck with a system which is outdated and only gives you 30 megabytes. ■

Is Amstrad really setting out to take on the PC and ST? You voice your views. And the great Cover Disk debate starts this week - what would you like to see on it? Haydn Fitzwilliams prints your points



Sugar baby 1

Concerning the new Amstrad games PC reviewed in *Express* 148. I think that Amstrad has cocked it up again. It doesn't seem to be very good at the games market, does it?

I mean, Amstrad's CPCs and console were not the greatest and most influential, were they? And to top it off it is now trying to flog what must be the most expensive games machine on the market.

I realise that your comparison of similar packages for the Amiga and ST were useful in showing that the PC would actually be the cheapest, but let's face it, how many STE/Amiga A500 gamers do you know with a 40Mb hard drive, or even a monitor for that matter?

I realise that the PC starts off with a disadvantage in that any game worth its salt (or price tag), needs at least 640K to run. Therefore it makes sense to put 1Mb as standard.

I think that Amstrad should have saved £100-200 off of the price for the monitor. The hard disk is probably essential (even though a 20Mb drive would have been almost as good), because of the other handicap in that 99.9999 per cent of PCs have got hard drives and therefore most games

would be written to run on a hard drive and not a floppy. But if this PC was going to have a big effect on the market, then I do not suppose that it would take much to write for both hard drive and single (1.44Mb) floppy.

I also think that Amstrad should have designed a non-PC case and designed a 16-bit/AMIGA/STE case and for hard drives (which are usually internal units), a small box could have been made so as a 3.5-inch drive could fit in and then plug into an expansion port as with the Amiga and ST.

If you take the price of the hard drive and the monitor away and designed a 16-bit case, then I think it would be a viable alternative even to the almighty Amiga.

Another point I would like to make is that you can probably buy a PC with a 386SX motherboard and exactly the same specifications (except for the sound card) for the same if not cheaper price. This other PC would even have expansion slots and room for a coprocessor.

Just think, if Amstrad were to cut out the hard drive and monitor it might be viable to fit a 386SX motherboard and sell it with Windows 3. That would really give the competition a run for its money and I bet the games PC would end up winning. But in the end, I

honestly think that any other £1,000 PC would do just as good, if not a better job, than the Amstrad effort.

I PERSONALLY DON'T think Amstrad is really setting out to take on the ST and Amiga with its games PC. It's identified the PC as the fastest growing sector of the games market and as such is pitching the new machine against other PC games packages that may come on the market.

It's even dropping rumours now that it intends to bring out a CD-PC early next year to further consolidate this position. I agree though - no one in their right mind will pay £1,000 for a PC that they can't upgrade. Having set out his stall, Mr. Sugar will probably find other market traders radically undercutting him

It was with great interest that I read the front page article in *Express* 148 about 'Amstrad Attacks Amiga and ST'!! However, I think Amstrad and yourselves have missed the point somewhat.

Yes, Amstrad's machine is a real bargain when you notice that it is twice as fast as the other two, has more colours on screen, good sound, etc. Yes, the PC has a massive software base, but in the

end it all comes down to price.

There is a direct comparison in your article which makes Amstrad's offering extremely attractive, that is if you were intending to buy a monitor and a hard drive with your Amiga or ST.

However, the reason the ST and Amiga are so popular is that you can enter the world of power computing for between £300 - £400. £1056.32 for Amstrad's machine may be good value, but there are not many parents who'll buy them as Christmas or birthday presents.

To really take on the Amiga and ST someone needs to build a PC without the hard drive and monitor. It would have to be a similar shape to the Atari and Commodore machines and house a TV modulator, soundcard, joystick ports, MIDI, etc, and be released for a maximum of £450. Kids and parents could then add a hard drive or monitor when finances allow, as they do with other machines.

This is the only way to attack the home market and with PCs being so popular in America, Amstrad or any other ambitious company would really make a killing.

Let's face it, anyone who can afford over £1,000 for their machine would have had no trouble getting a similar bundle to Amstrad's at a similar price. Also, with the PC market being so huge, it is quite simple to pick up a better specified machine at auctions, at a lesser price. An auction I recently attended had a Compaq 386 with VGA card, 100Mb hard drive and 2Mb memory and this was sold for £950. It was almost brand new!

So, come on, Amstrad, if you really want to challenge the ST and Amiga, compete on an equal footing and throw it all into a single box. Let the customer pay his £400, plug into the TV and go!

YES I THINK you're probably right Adrian. I'd only add that I reckon many more parents will buy a PC for their kids knowing they can also use it - for serious software. I'd also like to think that games are changing anyway - to the point where they need hard disks and 1Mb of memory as standard. People will buy a machine on the strength of software - look at what *Starglider* and *Defender of the Crown* did for the ST and Amiga back in '87. I reckon we could see the same thing happen with *Wing Commander 2* for the PC

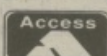

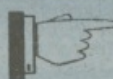

MACINTOSH

MODE 32

Users of System 7 on the Macintosh II, IIfx, IIfx and SE/30 have been somewhat disappointed to learn that their ROMs are not '32-bit clean'. What this means is that they cannot run System 7 in 32-bit mode – they will only work in 24-bit mode, which means that they are limited to 8Mb of RAM and about 12 or 13Mb of virtual RAM.

The Mac IIsi, IIfx and IIfx have newer, 32-bit clean ROMs so they are not affected by the problem, while other Macs don't have the 68851 PMMU (Paged Memory Management Unit) and so can't run virtual memory anyway.

To get around the problems for those Macs which should be able to run in 32-bit mode but can't, American company Connectix has been marketing a program called *Mode32*, which comes in the form of a Control Panel Device and System Extension and which patches the System code to 'clean up' the ROMs and allows them to access the full 128Mb of physical RAM and 1 Gigabyte of virtual RAM.

Of course, many Macintosh owners have asked why Apple itself hasn't addressed this problem – so many Mac owners, in fact, that Apple has actually licensed *Mode32* from Connectix, and will now distribute it to all Mac users via

AppleCentres and bulletin boards.

In the USA, people who purchased the Connectix product before 5 September will be eligible for their money back, as long as they can produce a receipt; anyone who just returns the main program disk will automatically get a \$100 refund.

There is no news as yet as to what arrangements Apple UK will make regarding any refund procedures – for up-to-date information, dial 100 and ask the operator for FreeFone Apple.

WHAT IS QUICKTIME?

We've had a number of letters from people asking what, exactly, Apple's new *QuickTime* system extension is. Since its

announcement a few weeks ago, the computer press has been full of praise, but many users have been left wondering just what it is and what advantages it will offer.

Essentially, *QuickTime* is an extension to System software which allows you to have speech and movies integrated seamlessly into documents which you produce with applications such as word processors.

For some years, third-party companies have been manufacturing add-in boards which allow the Mac to display moving video on-screen, but the great advantage of *QuickTime* is that it is a totally software-based solution. Just as you can presently copy and paste

POSTCARD FROM AMERICA

The productivity of Macintosh users worldwide took a sharp nose-dive in August. This was directly attributable to the release of the *More After Dark (MAD)* collection of display software for Berkeley Systems' popular screen saver, *After Dark*.

After Dark is not just one screen saver, but is an ever growing assortment – a candybox of fun programs. It's infinitely extendible through add-on modules. The modules are simply placed in a folder, and are instantly available for selection through its Control Panel Device.

The best of the bunch is *Lunatic Fringe*, an arcade game by Ben Haller, author of the fantastic shareware game, *Solarian II*. You command a little spaceship, fighting nasty Puffers, Hammerheads, and other beasts, while dodging meteors. It's irresistible, and relentless.

Berkeley Systems holds a contest every year for innovative

screen-savers, and some of the 1990 winners are featured in this set. For compulsive users, afraid of any hint of viral infection, there's the *Virex-D* module that scans for viruses when you're off washing your hands. Another add-on of note in the package is *GraphStat* which creates random and hilarious labels for graphs thrown on the screen.

The Berkeley MacUsers Group has come out with its own set of *After Dark* modules. The five-disk set includes 40 modules of varying quality. Some are runners up from the contest. I took a perverse liking to *Off the Air*, which simulates a television that's been left on after the station has stopped broadcasting. *TerrainMaker* draws a 3-D map of mountains and lakes. There's a disk of colour pictures for the slide show module, and three disks of PICS files – flip-book-style animations.

PICTs, text and so on between applications, the clipboard and the scrapbook, so *QuickTime* will allow you to do the same with sounds and video clips. When you copy a clip, a small control panel will be present which allows you to run it, select a specific frame or whatever.

Unlike some of the dedicated boards, *QuickTime* cannot play back video in real-time - that would be too much to expect. However, it will allow 'movies', as it calls these clips, to be replayed at between 10 and 15 frames per second - depending on the Mac used - which is perfectly adequate for most applications.

To save disk space, the extension comes complete with software to perform image compression according to the JPEG (Joint Photographic Experts Group) standard - which has the bonus effect that you will be able to use it to compress any still images (TIFFs and so on) which are presently cluttering up your hard disk. Image compression and expansion is done in real-time.

Although no applications (other than a few demonstrations) yet take advantage of *QuickTime*, we can expect the first to appear in the near future. For instance, it is highly possible that the new version of Microsoft Word, 5.0, which is due sometime around the end of the year, will have support for *QuickTime* movies. CE Software's *QuickMail* e-mail system is also likely to build in support soon - making it possible to e-mail someone with a short movie of you

reciting your message.

A little more work from developers and people will never have to congregate in the same room for meetings ever again - they'll just watch movies of each other on their Macintosh desktops!

PORTABLE TAX

The US government has put a tax of around 63 per cent on the Active Matrix LCD screens which Apple uses for its Macintosh Portable. This is because they are imported from Japan, whereas an American company also makes a similar product. However, the Japanese version is rather less expensive, which is why Apple chose to use it.

The American government took exception to this, saying that Apple should buy American rather than foreign products, and has imposed a 62.7 per cent import tax on the Japanese screens.

What the government doesn't seem to realise, though, is that Apple has manufacturing plants in other parts of the world - including one in Cork, Ireland. So unless Apple can persuade Congress to change its mind - a procedure which could take up to 18 months - the company is very likely to simply switch the manufacture of any products which use the Active Matrix screen out of the States, and thus reduce the amount of work for staff in the factories.

Perhaps the US government should have thought a little longer about that one...

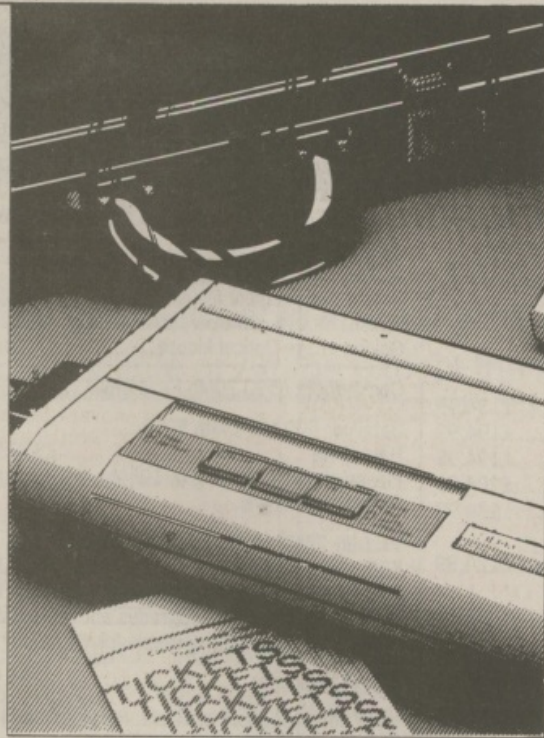

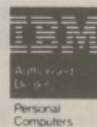

The trouble is, you see, that the PC market is incredibly snobby. No-one believes that a machine can be any good unless it uses the latest Intel mega-chip, or that software can be any use to anyone unless it costs as much as a return air flight to New York!

CPC IN DECLINE?

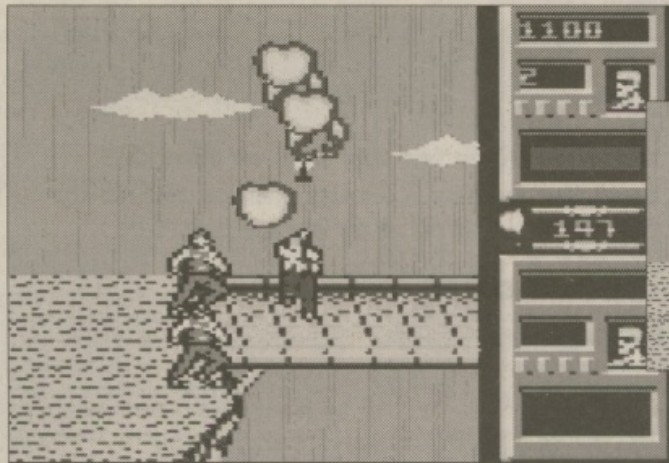
Latest sales figures from the software industry (see the news story this ish) show a depressing decline of a whopping 45 per cent in Amstrad sales over the past year. Ouch!

The figures are not definitive, and – importantly – don't include information from Ocean, but they're still cause for concern, to say the least! Both the Speccy and the C64 did better, according to the figures available, but not much.

The strange thing is, there are still plenty of games coming out on the Amstrad. Although gloomy industry pundits are giving the CPC a thumbs-down, software houses are nevertheless continuing to support it. The proof of the pudding, as they say, is in the eating. There's a large and active CPC user base out there, and it's not going to go away overnight.

MERCUS

Mercus was (is?) quite a hit in the arcades, what with its simple principle of

relentless, mindless violence... but what's US Gold's CPC conversion like?

Well, as a conversion it's actually extremely good. It retains the arcade machine's seen-from-above-and-behind pseudo 3-D view, and you can play either a one-player or simultaneous two-player game.

The plot's a pretty simple one. The American president has been kidnapped while on safari in Africa (in the bush... ho ho...), and the American government has decided that the best chance of getting him out lies with sending in a couple of highly-trained mercenaries.

The action is a lot like *Ikari Warriors*, but with some really nice, colourful graphics. You trot along exploring each

of the eight levels (but generally heading up the screen) shooting the bad guys full of holes and picking up supplies as you go. At the end of each level there is an extremely nasty guardian to get past – a helicopter or a tank for example. Well, that's the theory. In fact, the guardians aren't terribly hard to do away with. You simply hold down Fire, pumping them full of lead, until either you or they turn up their toes. Not very scientific, unfortunately.

And that's really the problem with the whole game. There's plenty of action, to be sure, with swarms of enemy piling on to the screen all the time. The trouble is, there are so many of them that you're bound to take hits. It's a question of

quantity, really. Getting good at the game merely means learning to take fewer hits, not avoiding them altogether (it can't be done). That takes away a lot of a game's immediacy.

Mercus really is a great conversion of the coin-op. But then the coin-op didn't really exude depth, and there's no way the CPC can produce the same level of graphics and smoothness.

If you want to rescue Bush from the bush, it'll cost you £11.99 on tape or £16.99 on disk. Not much to save the world from chaos and a *Mercus* nutter would soon wipe that sum out playing their fave game in the arcades. Anyone else would be better off saving their loot.

I always try to cover the most innovative and original games in this column, avoiding poor licences and arcade rehashes as much as possible. But here is a quick glimpse at some of the 'turkeys' currently available, along with a couple of reasons not to buy them.

• *Chase HQ* (Hit Squad) – Covered in my review of 'Power Up' in *Express* 127, this is one of the worst racing games ever. Abysmal mono graphics, sluggish car control, tedious from the word 'go'.

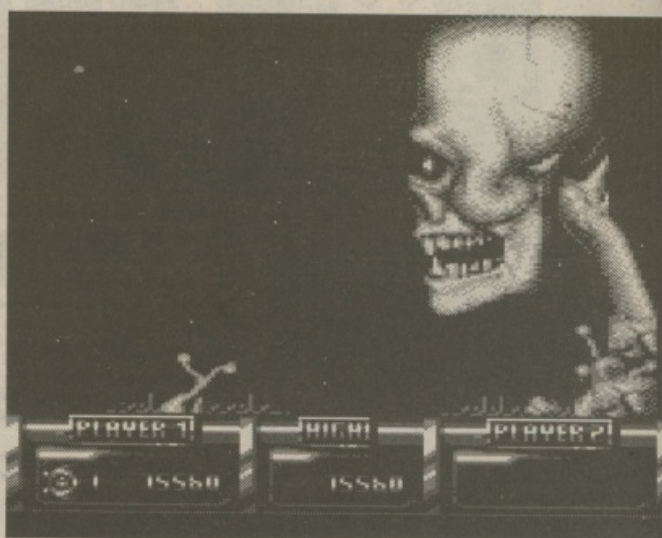
BUDGET BLASTING

Good shoot-'em-ups on the C64 are few and far between, and very few of those manage to combine great aesthetics with playable action.

That's what Bob Stevenson and Doug Hare set out to change in late 1988 with *IO*. The duo, collectively known as Kinetic Design, had been working on CNET demos for many years, so *IO* promised to be something special.

Indeed it was, and now the game is available for a budget price courtesy of Zeppelin. It is based around four levels, each one becoming more difficult than the last, and the aim of each one is to survive the alien onslaught and destroy the mother-alien at the level's climax.

As far as extra weapons are concerned, there are very few; extra speed, rapid fire and remote orbs (of

which you can obtain just two). Not exactly spoilt for choice, but the gameplay doesn't really suffer as a result – if anything, it makes for more interesting play.

Simple yes, easy no. *IO* is incredibly tough, especially without any weaponry enhancements, presenting what appears to be an impossible challenge. What's more, you'll be lucky to get past some of the mother ships unscathed as most of them occupy nearly half a screen.

The highlight of *IO* is the graphics –

simply gorgeous in every respect. The landscapes are colourful and intricately detailed, the alien sprites superbly animated, and the motherships totally breathtaking.

Sound effects are clear and crisp, and there is some rousing David Whittaker music at various points.

If you fancy a decent challenge and have the will power to persist, then grab a copy of *IO* – you won't regret it.

PD DISCOVERY

It's easy to think of public domain software as being the exclusive preserve of those smug 16 bit owning types, but the Speccy has a sack-load of PD and some of it is very good indeed.

Particularly welcome around these parts are PD games and I've recently played one that would be a pretty good buy at £2.99 and for free(ish) represents a bright flashing neon sign bargain!

Dice Mania is a simple but frustratingly addictive puzzle affair from the well worn keyboard of fabulously talented tech-head musician Dave Gosnall, an old friend of this column, I'll have you know.

I'm not sure if he's such a pal any more though because *Dice Mania* has been causing tense, nervous headaches and development of a facial twitch after prolonged play. Five or so lines of instructions are all you need to read before play as you place dice of different values on a five by five grid in order to make complete lines of the same number.

If you manage this the line disappears, Tetris style, leaving space for more dice.

You also have three bombs, which let you place a die on an already occupied square. These soon run out and the game itself finishes when you fill up all 25 squares, something which happens with poll tax bill-like regularity.

Crisp monochrome graphics do the job in hand admirably, as you desperately try to avoid inevitable failure and pay respect to the game design which makes you look several moves ahead, like all good games of strategy.

Dice Mania is an excellent puzzle game, a lethal combination of Yahzee, Tetris and noughts and crosses which could well reduce your brain to a steaming pool of sludge in a frighteningly short space of time.

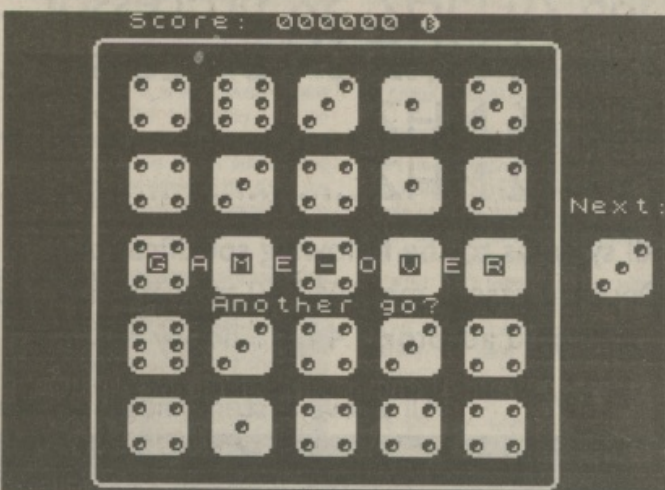

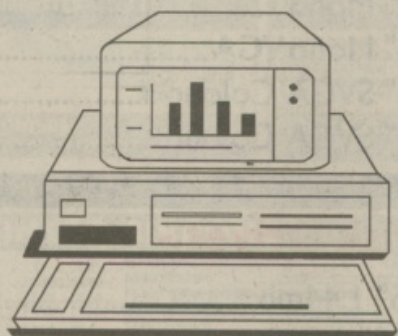

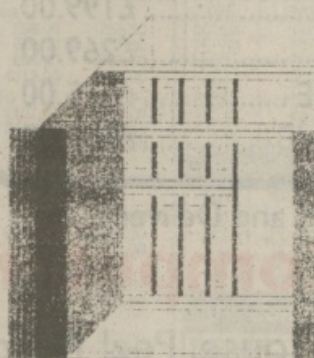

One of the main problems of portables, is that, it would be nice to play some of the games on a full size TV when you're at home, as some of them are a lot better than table top console ones.

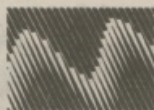
Well, you'll soon be able to with the Lynx, as Atari has come up with a gadget that will take audio/video signals from the machine and send them to a normal monitor/TV.

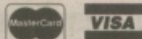

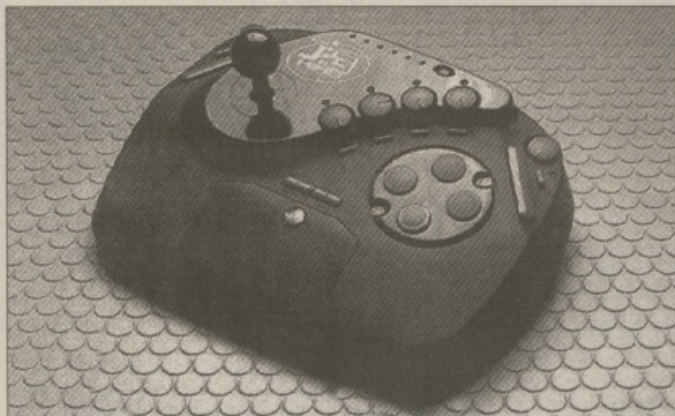

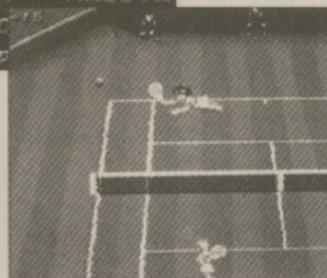

HELP WP Directories

I do a lot of work with my word processor on my 1040STF and I produce a lot of small files. I find that my .DOC and .BAK files clutter up my directories, making it difficult to find a particular file.

Is there a way of hiding files I don't need to see so that they don't appear in desktop windows? Can I change the order files appear in the file selector box?

Peter Phillips, Lyme Regis, Dorset

THERE ARE SEVERAL WAYS to hide files on an ST system. The first and most dangerous method is to use a sector editor to change the file attribute byte. This is not recommended as it is very easy to destroy vital data. Another option is to use KnifeST from HiSoft. This is a sector editor amongst other things, but there is a very good option which allows you to hide files.

These files are revealed by the Knife ST program, so you can recover them. The safest method is to use FSELECT6.PRg, the PD replacement file selector. This is a small program which sits in the AUTO folder on your boot disk. This has a very useful option within it which allows you to change the file attributes.

You call up the file selector from within the word processor by selecting Load from the File menu. You then

highlight the file in the normal way as if you were going to load it. You then click on the ? icon on the file mask bar. This brings up a sub-menu which allows you to change the file name, date and time, and change the file attribute to Read Only, Hidden, System or Archive.

The file selector also allows you to list files in Date, Size, Name, Extender and unsorted. HiSoft is on 0525 718181.

HELP Amiga answers

I own an Amstrad CPC6128 and I plan to replace it with an Amiga A500. Please answer the following:

- 1) Has Commodore any plans for an new Amiga that will replace the A500?
- 2) Are colour ribbons available for the Star LC24-10?
- 3) Which is the best 3.5-inch external disk drive available for the A500, and how much is it?
- 4) Is the Phillips CM8833 MkII monitor the best you can obtain for the A500?

Andrew Garton, Warrington, Cheshire

1) **COMMODORE** has no plans that I know of to replace the A500. The company is introducing a new version of the operating system (Workbench 2.0),

and there is still some speculation as to whether this will be made available for the A500. The chances are that it will, so it might be an idea to wait until A500s start appearing with the new version before buying.

2) No, it's a mono printer.

3) The best drive is probably Power Computing's (telephone 0234 843388) PC880B Power Drive at £65. It has an anti-click facility, a virus blocker and a built-in hardware copier.

4) Yes and no. It is the best monitor in its price range, but you will experience some problems when displaying high resolution images. This is because of the 'interlace' graphics mode on the Amiga in which the vertical resolution is doubled by halving the rate at which the frames are updated. This results in a flicker common to all monitors. The only solution is to buy a flicker-fixer card, at over £100. You will also need an expensive multi-sync monitor to take advantage of your flicker-free display.

HELP DOS commands

I would like to call AmigaDOS commands from an Amiga Basic program. So far, I have had no luck, with the machine Guru-ing after every attempt. Can you help me by showing an example using the AmigaDOS 'list' command?

THERE IS AN AMIGA library function which can be used to call AmigaDOS commands. Fortunately, a facility exists within Amiga Basic to call external library routines. But first, you must get the library into a fit shape to be called. The interfaces to the libraries are all stored on the Extras disk in the FD1.3 directory. The file of interest is called 'dos_lib.fd'. This has to be converted to a form suitable for Amiga Basic. To do this, run the 'ConvertFD' program in the BasicDemos directory of the Extras disk. Place the output file, 'dos.bmap', in the libs directory of your Workbench disk.

Now you can write a program to access the library. An example looks like this:

DECLARE FUNCTION Execute&
LIBRARY
LIBRARY "dos.library"
x=Execute&(SADD("list"+CHR$(0))
,0,0)
LIBRARY CLOSE
```

The Execute& function is the part of the dos.library which enables you to call AmigaDOS commands. The 'SADD' function returns the address of a string (in this case the address of 'list'). The trailing zeros in the Execute call refer to the input and output channels to be used by the call: in this case they are the standard input and output channels.

Note that this will only work if run from the CLI or Shell. If you try to run this program from the Workbench, it will crash. ■

HELP Hi-Fi Output from STFM

I have a 520STFM and I was wondering if there is any way to boost the sound output as my portable TVs speaker is a bit tinny. I know that the STE has phono sockets, can I hook up the STFM to my stereo system?

Jonathon Kirkpatrick, Hastings, East Sussex

YES YOU CAN CONNECT your STFM to a hi-fi. You can make up a lead to run from the monitor port to the AUX input on most stereo systems. These inputs are usually Phono sockets, and these instructions assume this. You will need a 13-pin DIN plug, some twin individually screened cable about two metres long, and two Phono plugs (also known as RCA plugs). You also need access to a soldering iron or know somebody who can solder.

At one end of the cable, strip back and tin the two cores and the screening. Solder each of the cores to the centre connection of a Phono plug (fig 2). Then solder the screening of each core to the outer connection of each phono plug. At the other end of the cable, strip back the cores and twist them together before tinning, in effect creating a single core. Twist the screening of each core together and then tin that to create a single conductor.

The cores now need to be soldered to pin no.1 of the 13-pin DIN plug (fig 1), and the screening soldered to pin no. 13 (ground). Make sure that there are no stray

strands of copper wire touching other pins or between the cores and the screening. The cable is now complete.

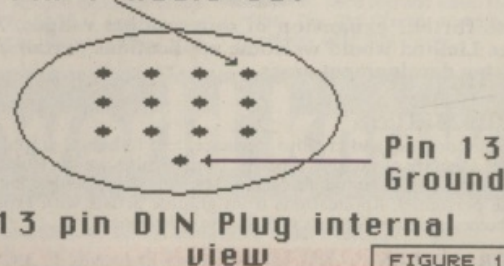

Having patiently waited over four weeks for my review sample to arrive, I've finally started using the latest version of Amnor's Protext (that's version 5.5 to those of you who don't know). I've always been a great fan of Protext – indeed, I've used it to write just about every article I've written over the past three years, during which time it has served my needs very well indeed.

I've never really been a great fan of thesauruses (thesaurii?), but I must admit that Protext's thesaurus comes in very handy indeed. It's not the kind of thing you'll find yourself using constantly, but it's nice to know that it's there whenever words escape you. However, as is the case with all thesauruses, you have to be very careful when using its suggestions as it is all too easy to make your writing sound as if it were written by a demented university lecturer.

It's nice to see that Amnor has taken note of the criticisms that I made of Protext 5.0. While everyone else was singing its praises, I was the only one around that doubted the program's inability to run in its own custom screen. And sure enough, Amnor has done me proud by building this facility into Protext 5.5.

I've still got a slight gripe though – now that it can run in its own screen, wouldn't it be nice to be able to actually change the screen colours. For some insane reason known only to the chaps at Amnor, Protext reads its colour information from the 'system-configuration' file. I don't know about you, but I like fiddling around with the colour palettes of programs!

Despite these minor gripes, I must admit that I'm very impressed by Protext. I won't go into too much detail about its features as you can read all about this new release in the reviews section of Express. But if the excitement is too much to bear, then give Amnor a bell on 0733 68909.

GVP GOES 24-BIT

If you thought that the Amiga Centre Scotland's Harlequin board was the best in Amiga 24-bit graphics, then GVP's new Impact Vision 24card will come as something of a shock.

It's a powerful 24-bit multi-functional colour enhancement card for the Amiga 2000 and upwards which will allow video

professionals to create broadcast quality video images and even animations in true 24-bit colour resolution.

The enhanced 24-bit colour resolution of the Impact Vision 24 offers a maximum colour palette of over 16 million colours, making it ideal for applications that require high quality ray-traced and digitised images. The unit also comes complete with a number of extra features, including a built-in digital keyer, flicker fixer, frame buffer and genlocks for both RGB analog and Composite video signals.

The board comes complete with a number of software packages which have been specifically written to take advantage of the Impact Vision's obvious talents. These include a powerful 3-D rendering package and (best of all) a much-needed 16 million colour paint package. The Harlequin doesn't come with either of these, so Impact Vision looks set to steal more than a few sales.

Built specifically to work with the Amiga 3000, the board will only work with the Amiga 2000 (and 1500) when used in conjunction with a special video adaptor board.

The price of this little beauty is going to be very, very close to that of the Harlequin, so we can all sit back and

watch the pixels fly when these two clash. Personally, my money's on the GVP card!

BLITSOFT BLITZ

First up is its new KickStart board which will allow you to have all three major Amiga operating system versions installed inside your Amiga – 1.2, 1.3 and 2.0 – when it is finally released. For game players everywhere, this card could be the answer to your dreams.

Unless you've got an autobooting hard drive installed on your system, the Amiga's internal drive is a lifeline which will render your Amiga useless if it ever becomes faulty. If this does happen, then it may well be a good idea to be prepared by purchasing BlitSoft's new Boot Drive Board.

When installed, this board will allow you to boot your Amiga from your external drive. Not only that, but it has an added advantage – it removes that terribly annoying 'click' sound that all Amiga drives make.

For Super-Card owners, BlitSoft has taken on a new software package that enhances this excellent utility device beyond recognition. Among its well hung list of features is a drive alignment checker, a disk analyser (displays the format and structure information of tracks), drive speed checker and a few enhancements to Super-Card's disk back-up capabilities. NEW STAR MAKES ITS DEBUT

A large number of printers are available for the Amiga from a wide range of manufacturers, but by far the most popular model has to be the Star LC-10.

If you're a Star fan, then you may well be interested to learn that the company has launched a successor to the LC-10 in the shape of the new LC-20, a printer which Star is flagging as the 'LC-10 for the 90s'.

The new printer (which is still a 9-pin – boo, hiss!) offers a draft printing speed of

180 characters per second (cps) and comes complete with eight Near Letter Quality (NLQ) fonts which are built in as standard. The new printer also boasts a 4K printer buffer, push tractor feed with short form tear off, paper parking and full Epson and IBM emulation. Sounds impressive enough.

The Star LC-20 costs £233.83 and is available from all good computer retailers. Alternatively, you can cut out the middle man by phoning Star on 0494 741111.

After last week's glut of games news (well, it was the CES after all) this week it's time to concentrate on the more serious side of the ST.

CYBER MEN RETURN

Very rarely does a completely new product appear for the ST but Supa Nova Developments seem to have come up with just that. Its new gadget is known as CyberDOS and is a host-slave system for linking STs to STs or STs to Amigas.

The system consists of a lead and several software utilities and is designed to allow the high-speed transfer of files and programs from one micro to the other.

This is not so great in itself – an RS232 lead can be made to do the same – but it's the package's extras that make it really useful. For instance, it will automatically convert any assembled program to run on the slave machine. So, if you've written a database on the ST you can run it through the link and it'll end up as a usable application on the Amiga.

You also get two sets of utilities. A standard DOS on each machine allows the transfer of programs and data, and facilitates the execution of any program. But there's another operating system that is written specifically for writing games under. It contains a complete set of disk operations, such as reading, writing and erasing files, music-playing routines, keyboard/joystick reading routines and all the other bits you need to write any game.

This replacement operating system does not use the ST's normal TOS/GEMDOS at all and only takes up around 30K, leaving about 500K free for your programs and data. There's a built-in monitor to display the state of registers should a crash occur and provide any other information you may need to correct it.

Together with all this there's a CLI (Command Line Interface, such as the

PD program *Gulam*) and its source so that it can be modified to your heart's content. The DOS comes in two versions: the development version which you actually use to write any programs and which includes all the error-trapping routines and extras; and a run-time version which you can be released with any games you write with no extra charge payable to Supa Nova.

The only thing that's missing from the package is a text editor and assembler, but this is a deliberate move so that you can use your own particular packages (such as Devpac) instead of learning a new one.

CyberDOS is aimed specifically at games programmers to make porting games between the ST and that other games machine – the name of which escapes me – simpler; D & H Software is already supposed to be using it for that very purpose.

PORTABLE STEREO

Sound Technology continues to push out musical goodies for the better-off ST owner. This time it's a removable magneto-optical disk drive designed specifically for direct-to-hard-disk recording systems.

As the company points out, with the amount of data that direct-to-disk recording generates hanging about on your hard drive, it's imperative to have a back-up. But backing-up in real time can take ages, and if done regularly as recommended it can seriously impinge on your time.

To this end developer Digidesign has come up with a drive that uses a removable double-sided 630Mb cartridge specifically designed for direct-to-disk recording. 630Mb will hold around 25 minutes of stereo audio on each side at a sample rate of 44.1 kHz. That means

you could comfortably fit most albums on one single cartridge.

Although the drive is designed for use with the Mac (why?) a simple convertor is available to enable it to be used with the ST. It uses the 3U format, accepts standard (standard?) 630Mb magneto-optical disks and like most hard drives has a standard SCSI interface.

The price has yet to be announced but going by previous magneto-optical removable hard drives for the ST (all one of them) it should be around £3,000. But then, if you're using a direct-to-disk recording system in the first place you should be used to splashing out that sort of amount.

DON'T BELIEVE THE HYPER(LINK)

Ask a PC owner about *HyperText* and he'll know immediately what you're talking about, but to ST owners it's a less familiar subject.

HyperText is a visual management system that allows topics to be linked in a non-linear way, so you can simply click on any idea that interests you and skip between topics rather than ploughing through in a straight line. Any subject

that can be broken down into small chunks of information is suitable for the *HyperText* treatment.

HyperLINK is a *HyperText*-style database/manager program for the ST. The system is composed of Applications, which can be anything from a message pad to a specific database or a map. The information stored need not necessarily be text; it could be a graphic, a sound or literally anything else you could store on a disk.

In an animal database, for instance, you could access a description of a duck as well as seeing a digitised image of it and hearing the noise it makes. The trendy term for this sort of tool is a Multi-Media application and it opens up huge possibilities. With enough memory and storage capacity you could hold the entire *Encyclopedia Britannica* on a hard disk and access any part of it with reference to any other part; anyone who's used a relational database will know how useful that sort of facility is.

HyperLINK has many features and programs included to allow you to build any sort of multi-media application. It's a complex program that requires 1Mb and preferably a hard drive, and deserves much more space than I've given it here.

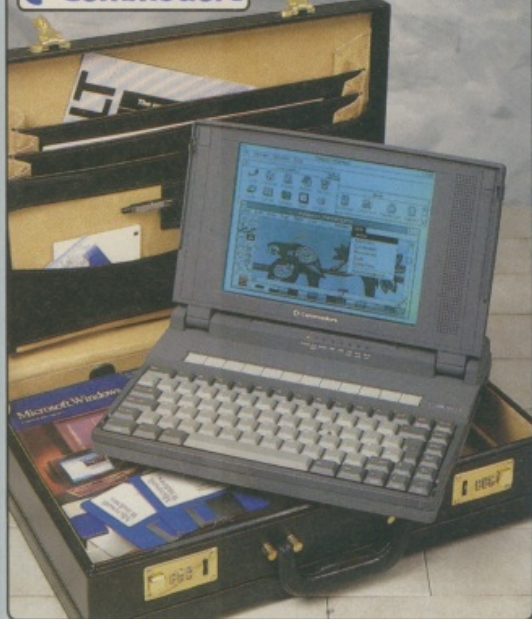

- The operating systems war heats up as Digital Research launches DR DOS 6.0
- IBM and Apple like Sweet Peas in a pod
- Sierra's *Police Quest 3* - a game with some arresting graphics and music

Digital Research recently made the latest move in its game of technological leapfrog with Microsoft by introducing a version of DR DOS that the company says features better memory management, a task switcher and more efficient disk management.

Version 6.0 automatically loads itself into high memory, along with network drivers and memory-resident programs, giving you as much as 628K of memory for applications on 80286 and 80386 machines, the company claims.

Running even on 8088-based machines, DR DOS 6.0 gives you as much as 612K for applications. However, for the 8088 and 80286 you will need to have a LIM-compatible add-in board to take advantage of the added memory.

Version 6.0 of DR DOS has an optional compression system that in many cases doubles hard disk storage space. The new operating system's task switcher lets you load as many as 20 applications at once and cut and paste information from one application to another.

The advantage Version 6.0 has over DOS 5.0's task switcher is that you can operate it both from the system's graphical shell and the command line, according to company officials. A new disk cache, based on *Super PC Kwick* from Multisoft, is capable of running applications significantly faster than the previous version.

Like MS-DOS 5.0, DR DOS 6.0 includes an Undelete feature that lets you recover deleted files.

Available now, the package costs £79. Existing users can upgrade for \$30 [plus postage] directly from Digital Research. Those who bought DOS 5.0 after 1 August can upgrade for £9.95.

Features include: read root and sub directories (which gives file info on sector usage and file status including hidden and deleted files), detailed bios parameter block information and a feature that follows a chain of sectors used in a given file.

SWEET PEA

IBM and Apple will form a second subsidiary to develop hardware, software, and multimedia services separately from their joint operating system and RISC workstation efforts.

The first project the two will work on is a favourite of Apple chairman and CEO John Sculley's, a palm-size system with a CD-ROM drive and miniature display that can access data from any computer or telephone.

Code-named Sweet Pea, the product is modelled after Sony's Data Disk Man, currently sold in Japan to the education market and in limited quantities to the business market. Sweet Pea, described by some as a, "personal communicator," could be used for such applications as electronic mail, file transfers, and remote order entry. It would initially be able to handle text and graphics, with sound and full-motion video capabilities added later.

Another project championed by Sculley, the P3-TV project, enables you to download a variety of products and services to a computer or television using a standard television broadcasting medium. Described by some as a cross between pay TV, cable and record and video stores, the technology would allow you to download movies, videos, and music, as well as information services, sources said.

As part of that effort, IBM and Apple would have to obtain the rights to the products' content and establish a system of royalty payments. The multimedia plans are just part of the wide-ranging development agreements that IBM and Apple are finalising.

XGA ON COURSE

IBM recently made good its promise to make its XGA graphics technology available to third-party developers by licensing UK-based Immos to develop and manufacture XGA chip sets.

Immos, a member of the SGS-Thomson Microelectronics Group, will have exclusive rights to manufacture and market versions of the XGA chip sets for both IBM's Micro Channel Architecture and Personal Computer AT bus architectures for the next 18 months.

The MCA version from Immos is available now, with the PC AT bus version expected to be delivered by the end of 1992. Both versions will be sold primarily to board makers and not to IBM's hardware competitors such as Compaq. SGS will also do an interlaced version of the technology, also expected sometime next year.

IBM believes the agreement will significantly shorten the development time as well as minimise the expense of bringing third-party XGA products to market.

THE PD COLUMN

From the weirdest of games to the most serious of software - James Leach puts you in touch with this week's new releases for your machine from Public Domain libraries all over the country

The Apple Macintosh range of computers seems to have more than its fair share of Public Domain. Especially when you consider how relatively few Macs there are in this country, and that most of the ones that do exist are tucked away in offices where they should be doing serious jobs and not running PD games at all.

But there still seems to be tons of Mac software available for the price of a disk. And Wizbit Public Domain are just

the people to deliver it to you.

Wizbit has recently released five disks, called *Wizbit Wonders 1 to 5*. These have all manner of games, desk accessories, puzzles and general time-wasters crammed on to them. Most useful are the desk accessories. Disk 2 is the best in this respect; it contains clocks (both analogue and digital), calendars and disk checking utilities in abundance. If you've just got a Mac and you're looking for trendy 'time-saving' applications, then you'll find them here.

There are games aplenty (nearly all working in monochrome of Mac Classics, Pluses and SEs). Glider, in which you must keep a paper plane aloft by flying it over the hot air vents in a house, must be one of the weirdest. It gets to you, though, and before you realise it an hour or two has drifted past. Other classics, such as *Breakout* or *Tetris*-style block manipulating games are also on the disks (Disks One and Three are filled with these).

More and more Mac PD must be going to that growing band of people with 16-bit home computers and Mac emulators such as Spectre GCR for the Atari ST, so Wizbit could be on to a real winner here as well.

AMIGA EXERCISES

Essex Computer Systems (formerly called Digital Applications) has just released two very useful Amiga disks. One is called *System Exerciser* which checks your entire computer system (along with any disk drives you're added to it). It keeps a careful eye on disk accuracy and speed. If the access times aren't exactly right it'll notify you. It also reports any faulty operating procedures and basically watches out for faults within your set-up. Getting hold of *System Exerciser* when your Amiga seems to be working fine might be a bit pessimistic, but it's definitely a useful disk to have.

ECS has also put out *Super "C"*.

The idea is that it replaces both the CLI and the Workbench, and it's one disk which contains the existing C: directory. It contains all the old DOS commands plus a truck-load of new ones.

Everything is explained from a user-friendly system of menus. The disk is flagged as being "as near to a hard drive as you can get using floppies". Incidentally, both these disks are for the

more technically-minded user, but the quality of the programs and the instructions on them are superb.

Kicking off into the Amiga PD world is Shieldsoft PD of Clwyd. As well as providing the excellent *Vector Designer* (which perfectly complements the *Red Sector Demo Maker* reviewed in issue 149), Shieldsoft is appealing for new Amiga programmers to contact them with potential PD releases. It also runs a helpline for programmers trying to get to grips with the machine (the number is 0745 343044). Shieldsoft is also one of the cheapest organisations I've found, so it deserves a mention on that score.

WORM OPPRESSING

If you're looking for a decent PD word processor for your Amiga, Software Expressions has just the thing. It's called *Transcript* and quite simply, it does everything a decent word processor should do. There are a lot of functions such as search, replace, save as ASCII

and so on, and the on-disk instructions go through all the possibilities with a gratifying degree of clarity.

Protext it isn't, but *Transcript* certainly is quality PD, so if you're into words (and you don't want to part with huge wads of cash), it's got to be high on your list.

Also from Software Expressions is *Cabaret Asteroids*. Weird name, familiar game. It's a perfect *Asteroids* clone, even down to the wry writing on the high-score tables. For those who aren't familiar with this venerable old classic, you control a spaceship which can rotate and thrust, but as there's no gravity you sail on blithely in the direction you last moved. Also flying round the screen are huge asteroids which you'll have to blast into bits if you're to survive. It's a great game, and *Cabaret Asteroids* is the implementation to get.

A strange Amiga game has also surfaced from Singer Public Domain Library. It's called *Wet Beaver*, but don't

Telescan has released another Scanner magazine on disk. Or rather two disks, as there is such a lot of information it wants to impart to you.

DINKY DEMOS

Demos are getting better and better, but occasionally you find one which is, well, silly. *Edd The Duck* comes courtesy of Singer PD. Edd achieved minor cult status on Children's BBC for a while by squeaking instead of making proper noises. And here he is, large as life on your Amiga, accompanied by the sampled soundtrack of his single (which sank without trace). If you have children who are fans of the green duck (and I'm not talking about Orville), it'll keep them mildly happy for a while.

Literature and it's not particularly long, but is very enjoyable and impressive in its execution. Oh, and the soundtrack is excellent as well.

The big release from the South West Software Library (also on ST) is the Shareware version of **Colourspace**. This is a light-synthesiser from Jeff Minter of Llamasoft. With the program you can manipulate various pulsating light sources to create what can only be described as psychedelic colours and patterns flowing in peaceful harmony across the untroubled surface of your monitor (that's enough. Ed). **Colourspace** is the predecessor to **Trip-A-Tron**, and they both have a great deal in common. Both can be linked to hi-fis to produce patterns that actually

harmonise with the music.

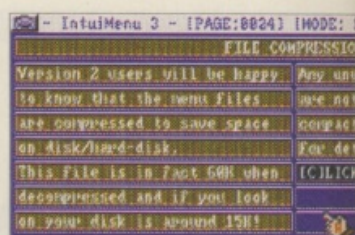
After the relative success of **Llamatron** for the Amiga and ST as Shareware, **Colourspace** is Jeff's way of saying thanks (and trying to make a bit more dosh). So when you get hold of the

program, send him a fiver and he'll send you the **Colourspace** manual and details of other stuff he'll be releasing. **Colourspace** is a lot of fun and Shareware deserves to be encouraged, so get those £5 notes out now.

FRONT END FROLICS

Intuimenu III is for the Amiga. It's a replacement for both the Command Line Interface and the Workbench and allows you to manipulate the 'front end' of your machine (in other words, get things done) much more easily and quickly.

The author has taken the best features of the CLI and combined it with the best bits of the Workbench. The results will please both experienced users and newcomers alike (once they

understand how it all works).

Technically, **Intuimenu** is Licenceware, so it costs £4.50 from Amiganuts, which passes on a substantial amount of that to the author. But even at that price, it's worth it. ■

YOUR GUIDE TO WHICH WARE IS WHAT

The world of Public Domain isn't as straightforward as it's often made out to be. Everything isn't totally free and unrestricted by copyright and so on. So here's the *New Computer Express* guide to the classification of the various types of cheap software.

SHAREWARE

The program is completely free, but is sometimes a reduced, incomplete version of the program. The idea is to send the author (whose name and address will appear in the program) a fee, usually £5 or \$5. He will then send you an updated, complete version of whatever program you originally got.

If the program is complete anyway, he could well

send you another similar prog he might have done. Either way, you're honesty and generosity get rewarded. Jeff Minter released **Llamatron** (and now **Colourspace**) as Shareware and, since it appeared on the *ST Format* coverdisk, 20 to 30 fivers from honest folk have been rolling in every day.

FREWARE

You can copy this, distribute it, give it away or do whatever you want with it. There is no fee for the program and there is no copyright. Most PD is therefore Freeware, and the price you pay for it is to cover post and packaging, the disk it's on and the overheads of the PD library (plus a little profit to enable them to carry on).

LICENCEWARE

You pay more to the PD library because it passes on a fee to the programmer, whose copyright remains intact. You cannot pass Licenceware on to friends.

PUBLIC DOMAIN

A generic term covering every program you can get for nothing or for a small fee (this includes Licenceware, Shareware and Freeware).

WETWARE

The biological organisms that are transfixed, in front of their computers long into the night, ie, you and me.

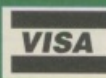

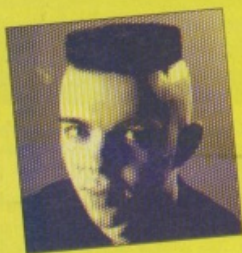

MAGIC POCKETS

16-bitters will doubtless already have noticed Prism's Pocket Power range of Amiga, ST and PC games at the astonishing price point of £2.99, but many have turned up their noses at the

old and often very creaky games available. All that's set to change though, as the company has just added a whole swathe of new titles to the collection, and some of them are of an extremely impressive nature.

Archipelagos, *Prospector In The Mazes Of Xor*, *Quadralien*, *Star Goose* and *Star Ray* (all originally from Logotron) are just some of the names which have previously attracted 80 and 90 per cent reviews in the computing press, and all of them are games which would command a respectable following in the ordinary budget market.

To be able to pick them up for less

than the prices charged by some PD libraries, then, has to be regarded as a bargain of the very first order. My personal favourite is probably *Star Goose*, a simple but classy pseudo-3D vertically-scrolling blaster with echoes of Gremlin's *H.A.T.E.* (recently given away on the cover of this very magazine), but *Star Ray* is a well-loved *Defender* clone with graphics which are still pretty striking today (although they do obscure the action a smidgen), a good three years after the game's original release.

If Prism can keep up this kind of quality at this price (and with another load on the way very soon – including a number of games from the now-defunct Hewson label, and the original version of the all-time classic *Boulder Dash* – there's no reason to suspect they won't), I think there are going to be a lot of very worried software houses out there by Christmas. Do yourself a favour and splash out – what have you got to lose?

(PS Top Tip of the month – if you're an ST owner, buy *Star Ray* first...)

LOST YOUR MARBLES?

Then why not check your console? Atari's vintage cult coin-op *Marble Madness* has suffered from a few terrible conversions in its time (the Spectrum version being particularly lamentable), but it looks like things could be put right this year.

Virgin is hard at work on the almost-complete Sega Master System version, and Mindscape hopes to have the game running on the Game Boy by Christmas. It's going to be interesting to see how the original's trackball movement system

POPULOUS

Tecmagik • Sega Master System • £34.95 ★★★★★

Synchronicity city! No sooner do I run a load of level codes for the re-released 16-bit version of Bullfrog's classic god sim, than Tecmagik comes up with the official release of the Master System version.

Now before all you ST and Amiga owners scoff and say 'Populous? On an 8-bit console? Don't make me laugh', it should be noted that this particular version features 5,000 worlds, some 4,500 more than the originals. Now numbers aren't everything, but when you

discover what an excellent copy this is in every other respect also, it's time to sit up and take notice.

The Teccies (as absolutely no-one has ever called them) have done a stunning job of translating the graphics to Sega's ageing machine, and the control system has been tweaked to be rather more accessible (as well as more suitable for the Master System's yucky joypad), making this version the easiest one of all to get into. The gameplay has survived the journey completely

intact too, and this is generally an all-round programming triumph.

The game itself you should all be familiar with by now (and if you're not I haven't got the space to go into it all now anyway, so I'll just say that it's original, challenging and mightily addictive), so you shouldn't need any further recommendation to go out and add this to your Master System collection this very minute.

The one downer is the slightly alarming £34.95 price ticket (even more jarring now that the Amiga and ST versions are available for a tenner), but if you're going to spend £30 on a cart anyway, you might as well go the whole hog and get something really special.

The Master System hasn't seen anything like it before, and with 5,000 worlds, I don't think we're going to hear many complaints about value-for-money this time.

DRAGON'S LAIR

Nintendo • Game Boy £25 (import) ★

Dragon's Lair. Now there's a name to bring a lump to the throat of video gaming veterans everywhere. Still probably the most 'gosh wow' thing ever to happen in an arcade, the original laser disk coin-op featured Disney-quality cartoon animations (not surprising when you consider it was done by Don Bluth, an ex-Disney artist) in a 'rescue-the-princess-from-the-dragon' fantasy epic which didn't boast anything very much in the way of gameplay, but was still an experience never to be forgotten for anyone who played it.

You might think, then, that the very last machine it would suit conversion to would be the Game Boy. And you'd be right. Game Boy *Dragon's Lair* bears no resemblance whatsoever to the arcade monster, being instead a pretty traditional scrolling platformer in the *Mario/Castlevania/Gargoyle's Quest* style that's so at home on Nintendo's hugely successful hand-held.



The only link with the original is the central character, Dirk the Daring (despite a box illustration showing him posing happily with Princess Daphne and Singe the dragon from the first game, his two companions don't make an appearance this time round), and really, he could have been anyone. But enough history.

This new *Dragon's Lair* carries one tradition over from its ancestor and that's the stunning graphics. Beautiful, detailed and atmospheric, these are quite possibly the best backdrops the little machine's ever seen. A fairly slow pace avoids blurring problems (you can choose fast

mode if you prefer, but it's close to unplayable), but the level of detail is such that it actually causes some confusion over where Dirk can safely stand and which ground features are deadly to the touch.

Matters aren't helped by the very imprecise and inconsistent collision detection where platforms are concerned (Dirk frequently finds himself standing on thin air with the floor going through his chest), but you do eventually get used to it. Not that that means it's an easy game, in fact it's one of the trickiest I've encountered, but the addictive qualities suffer when you lose a life by falling through a seemingly-solid platform that you were standing on quite safely a moment earlier.

I don't want to be too negative, because *Dragon's Lair* is still loads of fun, but from Sullivan Bluth I would have expected just a little bit more care than this. Take a look, anyway.

WARTY ROCK GOD CORNER

We received an unprecedented number of entries for the 'Ace Of Spades' competition in issue 147, but the lucky winner is the very rock'n'rollishly-named Nigel Crooks from Middlesbrough.

He very cleverly saw through my elaborate bluff and correctly stated that the Motorhead song featuring the line 'Moving like a parallelogram' was, in fact, that well-known rock classic 'Motorhead'.

A surprise package of software will soon be winging its way in your direction, Nige, as soon as you give us a call and tell us what kind of machine you've got. (But I really hope that it's an Amiga...)

This week's incredibly elaborate and involved competition has been postponed until next week, when the Games Week prize-buying budget has recovered from this somewhat unexpected shock.

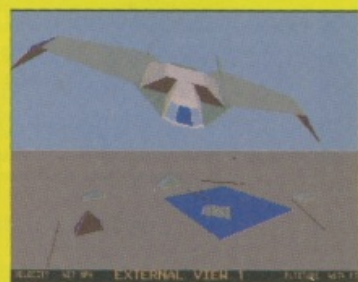

LIKE A HURRICANE

Digital Integration is a name that hasn't been heard in software circles for a few years now. Best known to older gamers as the creators of *Fighter Pilot*, the first successful action flight sim (ie, one where you got to shoot things), DI released a number of 16-bit titles over the years without notable success.

Now it's gone back to its roots with

Tornado, a flight sim based on the top NATO aircraft of the same name. There's not much to see at the moment, but DI promises a 'new generation of flight simulator', with high density of ground objects (a welcome change from all those games with stunning buildings separated by miles and miles of featureless green), 'exceptional detail', intelligent enemies, and all the usual techie nonsense. Watch out for it on the 16-bit formats in the middle of next year.

DI has been active in other areas, though, as the name behind budget label Action Sixteen. This re-release vehicle has seen some quality software, most

notably *North & South* and *Super Gridrunner*, and now DI is looking to capitalise with the setting up of a 'Premier' collection within the range.

Coming in at the higher price level of £9.99, the Premier name will cover higher-quality, multiple-disk games and allow for more extensive documentation. The first titles will be 3D shoot-'em-up *ATFII* and the strategy *RPGish Iron Lord*. The normal Action Sixteen range will continue as previously, with the Loricels duo of *Tennis Cup* and *Tintin On The Moon* also hitting those much-battered streets any day now. ■

DESPERATE HASBEENS CORNER

The games industry reeled with confusion this month as the nation's news-stands saw the appearance of two publications both boasting to be the country's best-selling Amiga games magazine.

One of the mags (a pretty feeble low-budget effort by all accounts) claimed the honour on the rather sad and pathetic grounds that the other didn't actually have an official ABC circulation figure (not having been on sale for long enough yet), but as the first rag's ABC is a cobbled-together thing made up of figures dating from a time when it was a multi-format mag selling to Amiga, ST and PC owners, and is currently the subject of an investigation following a series of complaints from several other publishers, it seems likely that a humiliating climbdown may be imminent.
