The chase is on. You're in charge of a super-charged unmarked police sports car patrolling the black-top Freeways that curve and stretch through cityscapes and countryside.

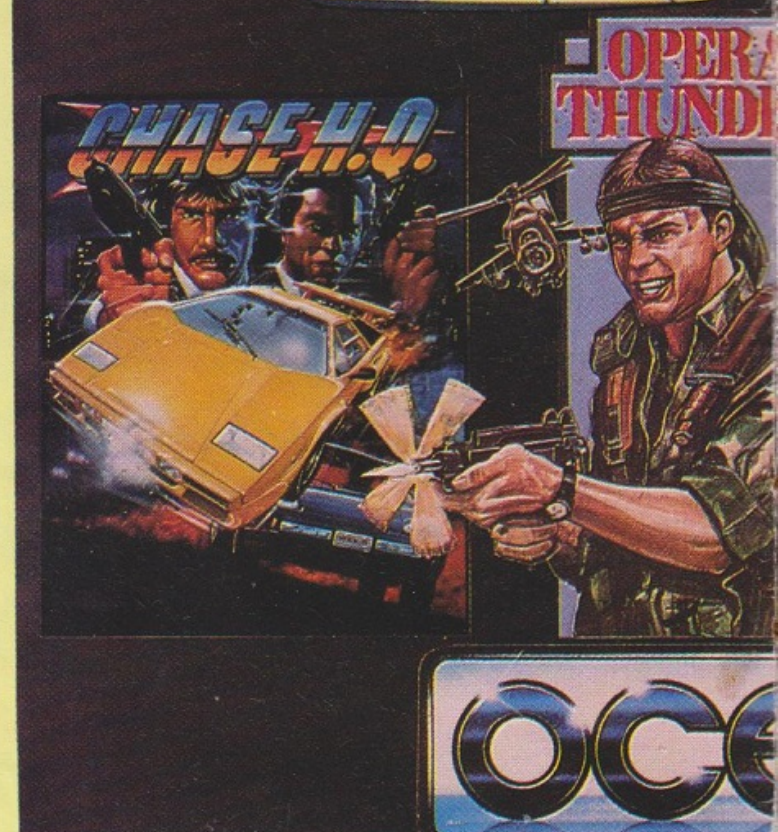

Joey's adventures take him through colourful screens and stunning backdrops of New Zealand country scenes.

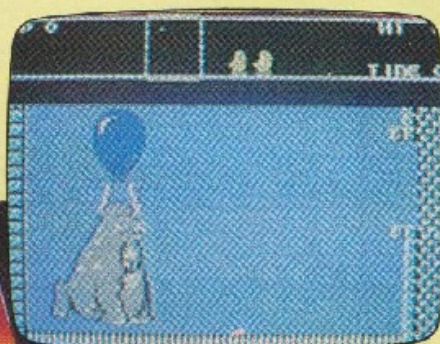
