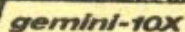

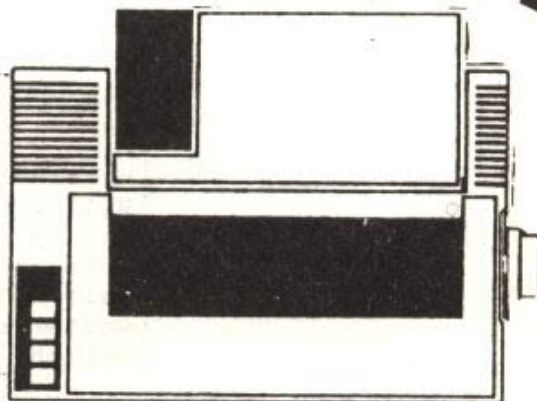

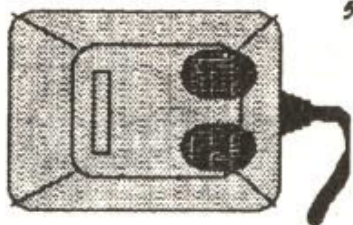

WIMPS - windows, icons, mice and pointers - have been a part of the computing environment long enough for the initial excitement surrounding their introduction to have subsided. Microsoft's Gem and Apple's Mac have both proved the desirability of such systems, while at the same time setting the standard for those to follow.

The ABC Elektronic Mouse package comprises the mouse, EASE software on Microdrive, and Giga-Basic, a Superbasic extension. The two-button mouse is neat - about the size of a cigarette packet and raised at the rear. The lead terminates in a D-plug which fits into one end of the interface, a black box about the same size as the mouse. At the other end, connected in the same manner, are two more leads. One of them is the connection to CTRL1, the other takes power from the ROM socket.

With the mouse connected and the QL switched on, EASE boots up in the usual way. Icons are displayed on the right of the screen and the pull-down menu bars across the top. EASE is very much more window- and menu-orientated than ICE (the software which accompanies the Eidersoft Mouse). It is possible to exercise greater control over how information is presented. EASE can be customised to suit your particular requirements.

GigaBASIC is a package of Superbasic extensions. It is quite different from the two other available toolkits, QJUMP and SUPER 'B'. GigaBASIC is designed for the more general games and small business applications programmer. There are extensive sprite commands, allowing definition, saving and loading, moving, animation and sprite-to-sprite collision detection. In fact, the only feature which seems to be missing is sprite-to-background detection. In addition, there are a number of Macintosh-style menu utilities. These allow for definition and placement of pull-down menus using either the cursor keys or the mouse. In addition, there are also a number of more general commands, tending to overlap with the other toolkits, including fill-any-regular shape, file handling, function key definition, digital/analogue clocks, an on-screen editor, Epson printer hard copy routine and font definition.

I have got it to work, made it compatible with Supercharge and shortened it considerably. As anyone who owns a Gemini will know, none of the printer drivers of Easel work. What I do is to compile this program as a task, change the boot program to load the task and then pressing the ALT key at anytime dumps the screen to the Gemini. This could also work with other programs. I have made the program a procedure called dump so if you wish to use it from Basic simply merge it with your program and call the procedure from within your program (don't forget to press ALT)

The Amstrad 464.

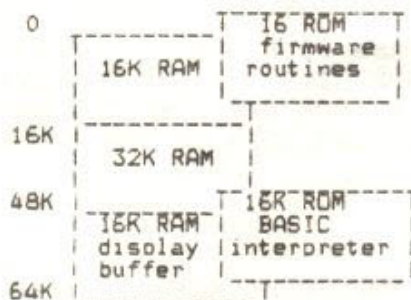
Amstrad users in South Africa are in a very unfortunate position not being able to get any information on their machines. Through this series I will try to make you understand your Amstrad a little better.

The Amstrad uses the faithful Z80A processor also being used in the Spectrum and older Sinclair machines. This processor has one drawback in that it can only address 64 Kilo-byte of memory. When the Z80 first appeared 10 years ago, this was considered massive.

To overcome this problem, Amstrad implemented the so called memory paging method. What this actually means is that the addressing range is shared by more than one memory device, with the assumption that devices sharing the same memory space could not be active simultaneously.

Paging therefore allows more memory in the same addressing range and like in the CPC464 can go up to 4 Mega-byte!

I will not go into the working of bytes and bits as this has been covered in many magazines and books lately. Instead we will continue with the description of the physical layout of the Amstrad range of computers.



AMSTRAD address mapping

From the layout above, it can be seen that the lower and upper 16K blocks in the memory map share the address space with the ROM. The Amstrad has been designed so that a write instruction will always address the RAM, while a read instruction could address ROM or RAM, depending on which one has been selected previously.

To see how this paging method would work in practice, let's consider the following example. When the Amstrad executes a program, the interpreter ROM would read the instructions from the lower 48K of RAM, so no confliction here. When a PRINT instruction is found, however, the display buffer is laying beneath the interpreter ROM. In this case a program in the firmware ROM is called to do the printing.

All the system or firmware routines are thus located in the firmware ROM. This includes all instructions that handle the Input/Output functions, eg. scanning the keyboard, printing and drawing as well as loading and saving on the tape recorder.

The firmware ROM contains routines of which only some are used by Basic. Included routines can be used by other languages (like Forth, Pascal, etc.) or your own programs. For example a tape verify function is included, but is not used by Basic.

Next month I will tell you more on how these programs can be used, but first some original Amstrad tios.

Before entering a program, type in the following line: POKE &ac00,1
You can now save up to 20% on program space! Who can figure out what this poke really does?

And for those fortunate chaos who own a legal copy of JET SET WILLY and can get a joystick in hand, here's a nice one. Load the game and when you finished admiring your Amstrad's sound capabilities, press enter to start. Next, type in the following password, ignoring the actions that may be caused by this. If you make a fault, then just press space, and start again.

HIEMMRAIDNAPRRRT

If you think that you have typed the password in correctly, press ESC once and observe. If you can hear something then try again, however, if you can see something just.....

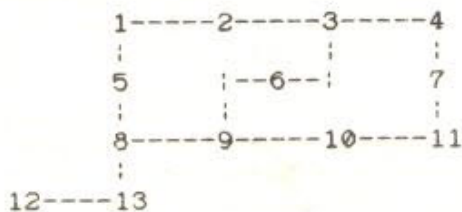

OH BROTHER

I refer to the item in the February newsletter where Alfred Kew asks how to get into the underline mode when using an EP44.

Details are given in the lower half of Page 44 of the Instruction Manual, Section 4 - 2, "Control Codes". One must use ESC + E, (Codes 27 and 69) for underline, and to cancel this one uses ESC + R, (Codes 27 and 82).

Mr Kew might like to try the following example in normal basic on his Spectrum to see how it works on the EP44.

```
10 FORMAT "b";300: OPEN #3; "b"
20 LPRINT "This is"; CHR$ 27; CHR$
69;" underline";
   CHR$ 27; CHR$ 82
30 CLOSE #3
```

In line 10, the figure 300 is a baud rate.

I am not familiar with The Writer, but presumably it will have an option enabling a Spectrum Key to be used to represent the control codes, e.g. in Tasword II the menu enables one to define graphics. I find it useful to use graphic 1 to represent Codes 27

and 69 and graphic 2 to represent Codes 27 and 82. The graphic symbol can then be inserted into the text and will be interpreted correctly when it reaches the EP44. On the same page of the Instruction Manual the Codes are given for Superscript and Subscript.

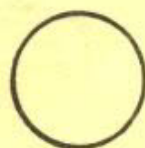
